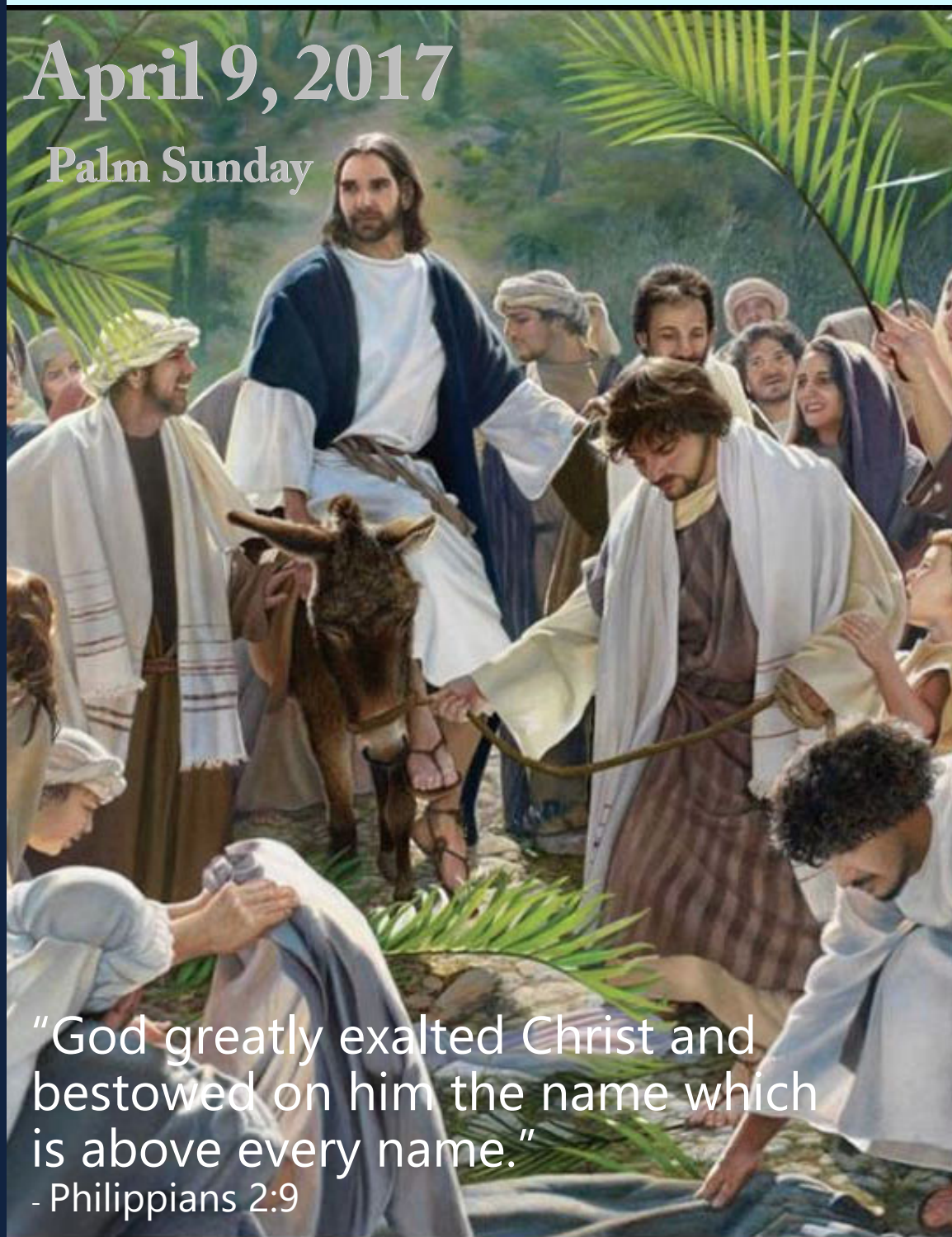

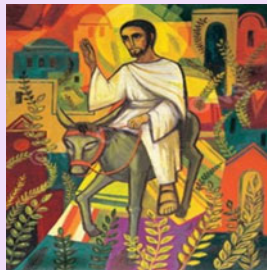

Come Celebrate Holy Week



As Lent draws to a close, we enter this final week before Easter: Holy Week. We begin with Palm Sunday. "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" As we wave our blessed palms, we are like the excited crowds that greeted Jesus as he entered Jerusalem. The mood is quite different as the liturgy continues and we listen to the Gospel that lays out the Passion of Christ. From the very high to the very low; I can only imagine that this is much the way the disciples must have felt as these events unfolded.



I hope this Lenten season has been spiritually fulfilling for you. This is the time we have been given to be reflective; to review the way we have been living our faith; feel remorse for what we have failed to do; be penitent; to become reconciled with our Lord and our Church; and offer alms to those who are less fortunate and to support our Church. I hope you take advantage of the Triduum from Holy Thursday to Good Friday to Easter Sunday. If you have never witnessed the Easter Vigil service, maybe this year is the year to make that a reality. I won't pretend that it is not a long service. It is. But there is nothing more beautiful than to watch the Rites of Initiation; Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation of adults and children who become full members of the Catholic Church after attending a two year program (RCIA) learning all about our faith. You are there to welcome them as full members of our community!



On Holy Thursday, we celebrate the gift of Eucharist given to us by Jesus and Institution of the sacrament of the Priesthood. We reenact Jesus' washing the feet of his disciples by washing the feet of twelve of the congregation. I remember a few years ago when Pope Francis washed and kissed the feet of prisoners, blessing each one of them. I was profoundly moved at the tears of prisoners who until that moment had felt lost and abandoned. Pope Francis at that moment told us how to serve one another. There is no dismissal at the end of the Holy Thursday service. Instead, the tabernacle is emptied and the precious Body of Christ is moved for adoration until midnight. I have never failed to be moved when I return to the Church and see the tabernacle with its door left open and empty; the sanctuary candle extinguished. There will be no consecration of the body and Blood of Christ until the Easter Vigil. We live the betrayal of Jesus by Judas, his trial and execution. And we too wait for the promised resurrection. Can you imagine how anguishing that must have been for the followers of Jesus? We live with the certitude of the Resurrection, but they did not know if what had been promised was actually going to come.



Come to the Church on Good Friday. Sit in the presence of the crucified Lord. Imagine yourself keeping watch with Mary and the other women who did not abandon him at this most horrific time. Sit with fellow members of our community and mourn that the sacrifice of Jesus was necessary to reconcile our sins. Remember that this act of Jesus bought us eternal life. Life triumphs over death. Love triumphs over hate. Good triumphs over evil. The cross becomes the sign of victory and salvation.

And finally, come join the rest of the community at the Easter Vigil or at one of the Sunday Easter Masses. Easter is the highest Holy Day in the Church. It is the culmination of what was promised.

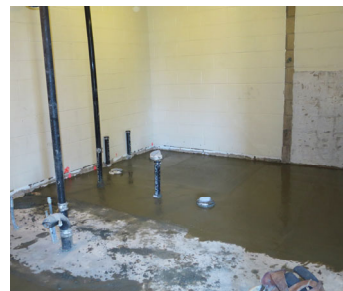

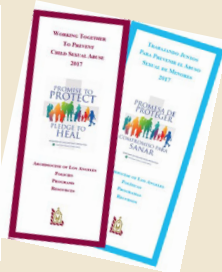
VESTIBULE RENOVATION

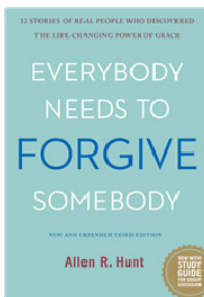

"Give forgiveness and you will unleash a flood of grace on yourself and on those around you. 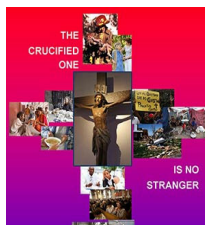

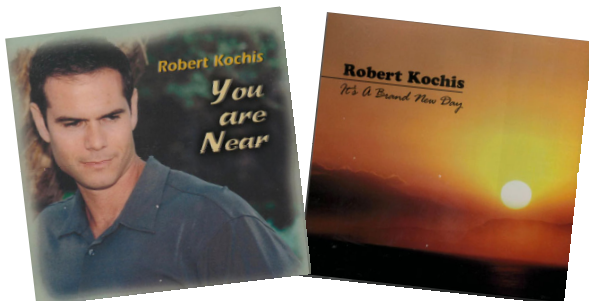
