

## Father's Day and St. Joseph

Father's Day, like Mother's Day, is well celebrated in the United States. On Mother's Day, many celebrate the day by taking mom out to brunch or dinner. Father's Day is often celebrated in the backyard taking the opportunity to enjoy the beginning of summer. This is a time to recognize the important place of dad. A father plays a singularly important role in the life of a family. Children need a father. Fathers have a God-given responsibility to their children.



In recognition of this, in 1989, Saint Pope John Paul II issued an apostolic exhortation on St. Joseph and the Catholic understanding of fatherhood – *Redemptoris Custos* (Guardian of the Redeemer: On the Person and Mission of St. Joseph in the Life of Christ and the Church).

Roles between mothers and fathers have changed significantly in United States families. Some fathers stay home with the children, while mothers go off to work. In the majority of households, both parents work to support the family and share the responsibilities of parenting and care of the home. How families divide household and child care duties is not important. What is important is that both parents are engaged with their children.



Just how important are fathers? A father is a source of strength and support. A dad puts the needs of his family before his own. A dad teaches his children the value of hard work, courage, honesty and good judgment. A dad creates memories with his children that will last them a lifetime...by teaching them to ride a bicycle, how to throw a curveball, tinker with a car engine or simply just by quiet-time together, allowing his children to revel in the security of a protective paternal love. A dad encourages his children to live lives of holiness and quiet fortitude. Most of all, through his own life of faith, a father teaches his children by example to cultivate a personal relationship with God through prayer, to live their lives according to God's word and guide them firmly along the path to eternal life. Whether he realizes it or not, it is through such dedication and commitment to his family, that a dad emulates Saint Joseph. What greater lessons could a man's life teach? So, yes, fathers are very important!

Fatherhood is a vocation and we are called to be actively engaged in this calling from God, in a way that quietly but effectively spreads the faith and extends God's kingdom in every place and age.

We can rejoice that St. Joseph through his marriage to Mary was caught up in the mystery of spiritual fatherhood and became a model of marriage, care of one's child, and a model to every believer and particularly for men in their role as fathers.

Today, as we honor and thank our dads for all they have done for us and for how much they mean to us, let us remember to ask Saint Joseph for his intercession on behalf of all dads, living and deceased, and that his holy example continue to be an inspiration to all fathers.

## PASSING OF FR. ANGELO BIANCALANA

Comboni Father Angelo Biancalana died on Sunday, June 11th, Feast of the Holy Trinity, at the Scalabrini Rehab Center in Northlake, Illinois where he had been staying. He would have turned 86 on August 5th.

Father Angelo was born in the little town of Capannori, near Lucca, Italy on August 5, 1931. He joined the nearby Comboni Missionary seminary at a young age and transferred to the United States when his family migrated to the Chicago area in 1951. He was ordained to the priesthood on May 25, 1958.


Fr. Angelo's first mission assignment was to the San Antonio de Pala Mission, serving Native Americans in the diocese of San Diego, California. He then served in Cincinnati, Ohio for five years. Fr. Angelo finally fulfilled his desire to go to Africa in 1965. He was assigned to the province of Uganda where he taught in the major seminary of Gulu. In 1976, Fr. Angelo was elected provincial of Uganda, and held the post for the next six years, including the terrible years of the civil war under Idi Amin and during the violence that followed.

In 1981, Fr. Angelo returned to the United States and served in the Chicago area for almost ten years. It was during this time that the La Grange Park Center was opened and entrusted to his care. He was approached about starting a group of Comboni Lay Missionaries and moved to Montclair, New Jersey in 1991 to begin this endeavor.

Fr. Angelo's remaining years were spent doing mission work for the Comboni Mission Center of Covina, California and at La Grange Park. He left Covina for the last time in 2011 and became a retired member of the Comboni Center community of La Grange Park.

Fr. Angelo will be remembered for his infectious missionary zeal, his easy going friendship, his love for the missions and for the poorest of God's children. May he find in God's embrace the feeling of perfect community he so fervently sought on earth.

St. Louise de Marillac Parish offers our sincerest sympathies to father Angelo's family and to his fellow Comboni Missionary brothers.



## FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI

The Feast of Corpus Christi commemorates the sacrament of Holy Communion and is celebrated every year on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, but was transferred to the following Sunday as it is a day of holy obligation. The Feast of Corpus Christi would have been celebrated last Thursday, June 15th but was transferred to **Sunday, June 18th**.

The feast seeks to remind us of Jesus Christ's sacrifice. Do this in remembrance of me. Luke 22:19; 1 Corinthians 11:24-25. The feast of the Corpus Christi brings about great joy and celebrations. No other devotion has received such attention in the Code of Canon Law which shows the importance the Church attaches to this feast.

The full name of this feast is Corpus et Sanguis Christi or The Body and Blood of Christ. The feast of the Blessed Sacrament was established in 1246 by Bishop Robert de Thorte of Liege at the suggestion of St. Juliana of Mont Carvillon, a Belgian nun.

At some parishes, after the last Mass on this feast day Our Lord is placed in the monstrance. The priest then carries Him to four different altars representing the four corners of the earth. While processing, the congregation follows and sings. At each altar there are readings, prayers, and benediction.
