Summertime



For many of us, summer is our favorite season. This is not surprising. Summer is the warmest time of year, the days are the longest and we stay outside more. Sunlight is a mood enhancer and you don't need a prescription to get it! We take life a little slower. Many of us take a vacation. Some of us like to grow things; there is nothing better than a home-grown tomato. There is a sense of relaxing in the moment, lingering, savoring, allowing time to flow by. There is often less doing and more being. And that is what I want to talk about today. How can we be more present; present to God, and present to each other.

Passing time is something each of us deals with in some manner or another. When we are children, summer seems to stretch out forever. As adults, it seems so brief. And the older we get, the briefer. Having four seasons reminds us of the passing of time. In the Church, we too, have seasons. Summer is Ordinary time. But that Ordinary time can be extraordinary, if we choose.

Time for prayer seems to be elusive to most of us. Our lives are so busy, how do we make time to pray. Even priests struggle to find the time! I know if you have a young family, there does not seem to be even a spare moment for yourself, not to mention spending time with God. But I urge you, even if the prayer is very brief, be sure to thank God each morning for the gift of life and before you go to bed, do an examination of conscience. Where did you find God this day? Where did God seem to be missing? What do you need tomorrow to be closer to God? And never forget the thanks for the blessings you have. I believe every one of us can do this. You might be surprised how just those simple brief prayers will improve your spiritual life...and we all need a healthy spiritual life.

Spiritual writer Sister Joan Chittister told this story: *"Where shall I look for enlightenment?" the disciple asked. "Here," the wise one said. "When will it happen?" the disciple asked. "It is happening right now," the wise one answered. "Then why don't I experience it?" "Because you don't look." "What should I look for?" "Nothing. Just look." "Look at what?" "At anything your eyes light on." "But must I look in a special way?" "No, the ordinary way will do." "But don't I always look the ordinary way?" "No, you don't." "But why ever not?" "Because to look, you must be here. And you are mostly somewhere else."*



When our spiritual selves are in good balance with our everyday selves, we will be able to pay more attention. We will see the needs of others. We will look at the many blessings we have in our own lives and we will be able to figure out a way to bless others. If you saw the movie, *"Pay It Forward"* you saw how just helping a couple of people and asking each of them to help someone else rather than paying you back for your help, became a movement that grew exponentially. What are we to do with what we have been given to ensure that others too are blessed? So I'd ask you then: Who have you blessed recently? You may not have much to give in the material sense. But that is seldom the most valuable thing we have to offer anyway.

What blessing does St. Louise de Marillac give to the Covina community?

Just imagine a world where all of us are trying to pay our blessings forward. May this season of Summer be exceptionally blessed, for you and your family.

TODAYS GOSPEL

Matthew 11:25-30

At that time Jesus exclaimed:

"I give praise to you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to little ones. Yes, Father, such has been your gracious will. All things have been handed over to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son wishes to reveal him."

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."

What the Gospel is saying...

The first part of the Gospel reminds us that faith is a gift from God. "I will give praise to you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to little ones." Jesus is saying our faith is a grace. Our faith is to be our anchor in life. In life we are faced with trials and difficulties, but our sanctuary is found in Christ. We only need to turn to Christ for with Him all things are manageable. We can endure all things through Christ and He will not give us more than we can handle.

Helping Others to Carry Their Burdens.

"Jesus behaved towards people in a way very different from the way many of the Pharisees behaved towards them. He came to free men from the heaviest of their burdens by taking them upon himself. *Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.*"¹

"Close to Christ, all our efforts and indeed all those things we find most difficult to bear if we are to fulfil God's Will become even pleasant. Sacrifice offered with Christ does not bring with it a feeling of harsh rebelliousness, but rather one of joyful giving."

"We must imitate Our Lord not only by avoiding causing unnecessary worries to others, but by helping people to bear the worries they already have. Whenever possible we will help others to fulfil their human task. We will help them to carry the burdens that life itself imposes on them: *When you have finished your work, do your brother's, helping him, for Christ's sake, so tactfully and so naturally that no one—not even he—will realize that you are doing more than what in justice you ought.*"²

PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN



All volunteers who work regularly in a supervisory role with children or youth must be fingerprinted. All volunteers who volunteer with children in the church, in the school or in Faith Formation must take a VIRTUS training course. St. Louise de Marillac has made the commitment for all volunteers to be fingerprinted and VIRTUS trained. Please see this page to the right for a list of places that offers Fingerprinting and the VIRTUS training course. Protecting God's Children is for first time volunteers and for those who have not taken the course. VIRTUS RE-certification is for volunteers who took the original course 4 years ago or longer. The recertification course renews your certificate for an additional four years. If you are not sure if your certification has expired or if you need to take the course please contact Susan Bugelli in the Parish Office at (626) 915-7873 or Cecy Luna in the Faith Formation Office at (626) 332-5822. Fingerprinting and the VIRTUS courses are free.

EUCCHARISTIC MINISTER TRAINING

Are you being called by God to serve in His Church as a Eucharistic Minister of Holy Communion? If so, St. Louise will have a Eucharistic Minister training on **Thursday, July 13th and Thursday, July 20th from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm**. You must attend both sessions. This is an open invitation for you to come with an open heart for an evening of prayer, discerning God's call for you. A Eucharistic Minister distributes Holy Communion at the regularly scheduled weekday and/or weekend Masses. They may also assist in ministering to the homebound parishioners, those in hospitals and in nursing facilities.

The guidelines for this ministry:

- You must be a fully initiated Catholic. (Baptized, First Holy Communion, and Confirmed).
- You must be at least 18 years of age (Confirmed High School students for the 5:00 pm Sunday Mass only).

Those entering into this ministry should be persons who sincerely try to live the Gospel message in their communal and individual lives. They should faithfully participate in the Sunday Eucharist and with God's grace strive to live their faith in every aspect of their lives.




Protect against potential danger.


