




A Christmas Message

Tonight, the long-awaited arrival of our Savior and Lord comes. Once again, we celebrate the miracle of the Incarnation; God becomes Man born of a Virgin. Hopefully, we used our time wisely during Advent, preparing ourselves for this miraculous event.



Since Thanksgiving, we have been bombarded with Christmas and Holiday messages. Advertisers have worked diligently to convince us to buy gifts. Stores have been decorated to the hilt, also to lure us into gift buying. In our homes, we have been wrapping presents for our family and friends, maybe sending out Christmas cards, and even possibly baking cookies to share with family and friends. None of these are harmful things, it is just Christmas is so much more.

By now, you have probably watched a couple of the Holiday movies that are brought out each year at this time. Several different productions of "A Christmas Carol;" "White Christmas," "It's a Wonderful Life," "Miracle on 34th Street," plus a few fun films like "The Santa Clause." However, I would like you to think about one that has been shown faithfully each year for more than 50 years: "A Charlie Brown Christmas." This simple children's cartoon has a powerful message. The way it was created and produced mimics the quiet and simple way Jesus told stories.



This cartoon has no wise-cracking animals, no clever dialogue, no enhanced computer graphics. It just uses the simple line drawings of Charles Schultz, children's voices, and a great jazz score. As Charlie Brown tries to find the true meaning of Christmas and rails against the consumerism and commercialization of Christmas, he is derided by his friends, sister and even his own dog, Snoopy. At the climax of the film, Charlie is on stage preparing for the children's Christmas play. He has brought a rather spindly tree to put on the stage because he thought the tree needed a home. Again, his friends and sister make fun of him. Finally, he cries out, "Isn't there anyone who understands what Christmas is all about? Linus replies, "Sure, I can tell you what Christmas is all about." Linus goes to center stage and stands in the spotlight. He recites the words of Luke, the gospel writer, to a silent audience, "And there were in the same country, Shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them, and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, 'fear not, for behold, I bring you tidings of great joy which will be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David, a savior, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you. Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes lying in the manger.' And suddenly, there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, 'glory to God in the highest, and on Earth peace, good will toward men.'" (Luke 2:8-14).

That's what Christmas is all about, Charlie Brown.

Luke tells us everything we need to know about Christmas.

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT



“A certain nobleman went into a far country to receive for himself a kingdom and to return” (Luke 19:12). This nobleman is Christ, the Son of God, King of all nations. His kingdom is over all men and over all things, both material and spiritual. He has everything in His hand as God and man. But another,

Satan, has broken into His kingdom and has made himself master of many of Christ’s subjects. In the old dispensation, only a small part of humanity, the chosen people, remained faithful to the almighty King.

Christ, the Son of God, came into this “far country” in order to become man and, by means of humility, obedience, and poverty, to cast out the usurper who had taken His subjects. He came to reassert His dominion over all those who had left Him, both Jews and Gentiles.

This year Advent is very short, Sunday, December 24th, being the only day in the fourth week. In the General Roman Calendar, today is the last day of Advent, Christmas Eve, and also (beginning with the vigil Mass) is the first day of Christmas time. The liturgical texts express wholehearted confidence in the imminent coming of the Redeemer. There is much joyous expectation. Most families have their own observances, customs that should be preserved from generation to generation. Today is the last day of our Christmas Novena.

A SPECIAL GIFT FOR YOU



Do you ever get the feeling that you are not enough? Not smart enough, not beautiful enough, not loved enough, not rich enough, not good enough... We all have these feelings from time to time, usually because we’re comparing ourselves to others. But God doesn’t compare you to anybody else. He wants to help you become the person he created you to be—perfectly yourself.

In this life-changing book, Matthew Kelly addresses the opportunities and obstacles we encounter when we decide to ask life’s BIG questions: *who am I? and why am I here?* Newly revised with an emphasis on spiritual growth and realizing God’s dream for your life, *Perfectly Yourself* is a book for anyone who has survived the collapse of a relationship, wondered if he or she would ever find a fulfilling career, or failed at a diet. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Children of the parish are somewhat focused on Santa Claus these days, who is keeping an eye on who’s naughty and who’s nice. Santa Claus, with his heavenly patron Saint Nicholas, has been more or less in charge of gift-giving to American children for a hundred years or so.

In other places, perhaps more attentive to our Christian tradition, there are different gift-bearers. In Greece, Saint Basil delivers the presents on his feast day, December 31, and makes sure everyone is sprinkled with holy water. The Baby Jesus is in charge elsewhere, called the *Christkind* in Austria and Belgium, *El Niño Jesús* in Columbia, and *Le Petit Jésus* in France, where he shares his duties with *Père Noël*. In the Czech Republic almost everyone is atheist, but *Ježíšek*, the infant Jesus, brings gifts to one and all. In Poland the “Star Man” is said to bring the gifts, although often he turns out to be the village priest in disguise. Saint Nicholas, not his Americanized cousin, is the giver in Holland, where he wears a bishop’s miter, and in Russia, where he wears a bishop’s crown.

Soviet Russia tried to dethrone Saint Nicholas and promote Grandfather Frost, but no one was much fooled by this attempt to squeeze religion out of Christ’s birth. One country has a saintly woman in charge of the gifts, Saint Lucy, honored in Sweden on December 13, when children serve their parents breakfast in bed, and others awake to news that they have been nominated for a Nobel Prize. Some children have a second round of gifts on Epiphany, when the magi assume the gift-giving duties.

In general, the gifts of Christmas are simple pleasures, not great heaps of treasures. Once upon a time, a new pair of socks or an orange was enough for us. No matter what gifts we receive, all of them are to point us to the true gift, and the true giver.

4 STAGES OF MARRIAGE


The 4 stages of marriage are:
