## Living Lent

"Repent, and Believe in the Gospel." Today, we begin the fifth week of Lent. In one more week, we celebrate Palm Sunday. It doesn't seem so long ago that we heard that exhortation on Ash Wednesday, "Repent, and Believe in the Gospel." We entered the Lenten season called to prayer, fasting and almsgiving. As Jesus spent 40 days in the desert preparing for his public ministry, we too have been called to spend 40 days in preparation for God's great miracle, the rising of Jesus Christ from the dead and his Ascension into heaven.



In Pope Francis' Lenten message this year, he warned us about succumbing to false prophets, allowing love to grow cold. "In reply to a question of the disciples, Jesus foretells situations where "false prophets" lead people astray and the love that is the core of the Gospel would grow cold in the hearts of many... How many of God's children are mesmerized by momentary pleasures, mistaking them for true happiness! How many men and women live entranced by the dream of wealth...How many go through life believing that they are sufficient unto themselves and end up entrapped by loneliness!"

Pope Francis warns us about a "cold heart." He blames greed for the cooling of our hearts. He even sees this cooling in creation: the poisoning of our soil and waterways; the seas that have become watery graves for victims of forced migration; the skies filled with planes and drones that drop death upon the people of other nations. And he does not just stop there. He looks at our own lack of love. That which he calls "spiritual sloth, pessimism, self-absorption, war and a worldly mentality that makes us concerned only about appearances."



What are we to do? By devoting more time to prayer, we allow our heart to see beyond self-deception and then find the consolation God offers. Almsgiving can set us free from greed and allow us to see our neighbor as brother and sister. "What I possess is never mine alone." Even in the encounters we have with beggars, could we see this as a request of help from God? When we give alms, we share in God's care for each of his children.

Fasting brings about a twofold gift. First, if we experience hunger, we are sharing an experience that the destitute and starving experience. In Sudan, Yemen, and Northern Nigeria 6 million people are starving to death, and another 14 million worldwide are facing impending starvation. As we deny ourselves of some small pleasure during Lent, let us pray for those who are truly hungry. The second gift, as we deny ourselves some material pleasure, is we express our spiritual hunger and thirst for life in God. Pope Francis says fasting "wakes us up." It makes us more attentive to God and our neighbors around us. It reminds us only God can satisfy our hunger.


Finally, we remember that on Ash Wednesday, we were told "Believe in the Gospel." "I give you my Word," says God. God gave us his Word - that Word that came as one of us, who died for us, rose from the dead for us, and ascended into heaven for us. I am struck by that phrase, "I give you my Word." This is a phrase we say, and we hear all the time. And rarely do those words become truth. Our politicians give us their word all the time and rarely do they keep it. We ourselves make these promises and fail to be true to them. But God's Word is truth. And all we must do is believe in the Gospel. Those Gospels contain all the teaching Jesus Christ gave us. Told in stories and parables, the lessons are all there. Witnessing his life, we were given a model to follow.

So, for the rest of Lent, remember, "Repent, and Believe in the Gospel!"

These are very special rites that are celebrated in the middle three Sundays of Lent at the liturgies where the Elect are present. The Elect are those in our midst who are preparing for Baptism. Part of their

journey to the font is that they have been received among us through the Rite of Acceptance, and they have been enrolled in the Book of the Elect in the Rite of Election.



## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Over the next two weeks, as we hear of the interior anguish of Jesus, we are led to the Garden of Gethsemane, the scene of a night of suffering, failure, and loss. In Hebrew, the word, Gethsemane, means "olive press," and it was an olive grove, although only a few trees remain. Olives can't be eaten off the trees, they need to be cured—knocked from the trees at harvest time, scooped into a stone basin, and cracked open by a heavy millstone. The crushing stone weight was itself called a "gethsemane," and once it was lowered onto the olives, oil from the fruit and the inner stone would drip into a groove and flow into jars. The night before his death, Jesus experienced such anguish that scripture says his own blood perspired from him, an image no one who understands olive oil production could miss.

Today, the Mount of Olives is within the city of Jerusalem and the site of the Church of All Nations, also known as the Basilica of the Agony. It was built in 1924, funded by Catholics in twelve different countries. An open-air altar on the grounds is used by Anglicans on Holy Thursday every year. Nearby is the Russian Church of Mary Magdalene, built by the czar in 1888, its magnificent golden domes a distinctive landmark. There is also another tiny Catholic Church, called *Dominus Flevit*, or "The Cry of the Lord," built in a teardrop shape in the mid-1950s. For centuries, the Franciscan order has had the care of the shrines of the Holy Land, and our Good Friday collection helps sustain these precious sites.

## SAVED BY GOD'S LOVE

God issues this invitation to intimacy by offering us the chance to have our sufferings transformed into the perfect love of the Savior, who first loved us.



## EASTER OFFERTORY




