

## 2018 National Prayer for America – Thursday, May 3, 2018

*In 2018, our theme will be **Pray for America—UNITY**, based upon Ephesians 4:3 which challenges us to mobilize unified public prayer for America, "**Making every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.**"*

Our Dear Heavenly Father, while we come to You in complete humility, we also come to You with boldness in the authoritative name of Your One and Only Son, Jesus Christ, who is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. In Jesus' name, fill us now with Your Holy Spirit and lead us as we pray in Jesus' name for America.

Oh God, we are burdened for our nation today. We turn from the sins that we have committed against your Word and your Name. We also turn away from and refuse to participate in skepticism, criticism, and cynicism in our nation. Lord, in the critical hour in our nation, we pray for unity in America. Only you can bring unity, harmony, and oneness in America. We pray for the churches in America to unify in Jesus Christ and to pray as one unified spiritual family for America. May Your Church pray for America passionately, perpetually, privately, and publicly.

**LIVING BRANCHES**

The Gospel and second reading for this Fifth Sunday of Easter emphasize the need for us to remain in Christ, and he in us. This shared life finds expression in the image of the one vine and many branches. We become living branches of the vine, members of the Body of Christ through Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation, sacraments of sharing God’s own life. The First Letter of John describes the fruit of this vine as active love of neighbor: “And his commandment is this: we should believe . . . and love one another” (1 John 3:23).

Our first reading from Acts shows us an example of someone who shares in Christ’s life in the person of Saint Paul. Paul’s fearless witness, even at the risk of his life, is proof to everyone that the risen Lord’s Spirit truly fills him with life and is bearing fruit in him.

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

In medieval times, one country, Scotland, linked its economy to the liturgy. Four holy days of the church calendar were keyed to the legal year. On these days, rents were due, clergy and servants were paid, and contracts and leases would begin or end. The term days were Pentecost (called Whitsunday), the Feast of Saint Martin on November 11 (Martinmas), the Feast of the Presentation on February 2 (Candlemas), and August 2 (Lammas), a harvest festival. On Lammas day, the first loaf of bread from the summer wheat harvest was given to the village priest. After the Reformation, which swept the Catholic festivals away, the term days were gradually detached from the old feasts. It was only in 1990 that the term days were anchored on the 28th of February, May, August, and November. Today the old Scottish universities are the last hold-outs, still naming their terms or semesters after the old festivals. Scottish students today may not know about the liturgical year, but they still call the fall term Martinmas, and the spring session Candlemas.

We encourage our entire parish community to visit with Jesus for a few minutes during First Friday Eucharistic Adoration this **Friday, May 4th** in the church between 6:20 am to 7:00 pm. Join us at 7:00 pm for Mass with the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

We are always blessed when we spend time with the Lord in Eucharistic Adoration. It is a time for each of us to fix our eyes on Him and listen to His voice as we adore Him. As we spend time with Him, the Holy Spirit can use this time to show us how we can overcome sin and temptation and to reach out to those in need.

The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed after the 6:20 am Mass until just prior to evening Mass at 7:00 pm. When visiting please keep in your intentions a prayer for vocations to religious life. At 12:00 noon the Angelus is recited and at 3:00 pm the Divine Mercy is prayed, at 4:00 pm to 5:00 pm the Guadalupana’s pray and sing in Spanish. At 5:15 pm to 6:00 pm, we have Children’s Eucharistic Adoration (see article below on same page).

Let us strengthen our faith in Jesus’ Real Presence in the Eucharist and rediscover the source of our hope that we all desire. Eucharistic Adoration is held every First Friday in the Church.


**April is Child Abuse Prevention Month— VIRTUS Training**

VIRTUS® "Protecting God's Children" is a three-hour training for adults which teaches the five basic steps of child sexual abuse prevention. This program is mandated for all adults who work with or around children or youth on a regular basis.

St. Louise de Marillac is offering this course on **Thursday, June 14th from 6:30 pm to 9:30 pm** in the St. Louise Conference Room. For other dates and times or to register on-line visit [www.virtus.org](http://www.virtus.org) and click on "Registration."

If your VIRTUS® certificate has expired (and you ARE NOT up to date on your online bulletins), you will need to take the "Keeping the Promise Alive" - refresher program. Keeping The Promise Alive provides ongoing awareness for the prevention of child sexual abuse. The material covered in **Keeping the Promise Alive** is designed to identify and reinforce the lessons of the original **Protecting God's Children® for Adults program** by clarifying some of the more challenging aspects of the sessions and strengthening the participants' ability to recognize risky behavior in their environments and take action to intervene in potentially threatening situations. This program answers the questions, "What have been some results of the Protecting God's Children program, and what else can we do to keep all children safe?"


