

## The Ascension of our Lord – Sunday, May 13, 2018

The Ascension of Our Lord, which occurred 40 days after Jesus Christ rose from the dead on Easter, is the final act of our redemption that Christ began on Good Friday. On this day, the risen Christ, in the sight of His apostles, ascended bodily into Heaven (Luke 24:51; Mark 16:19; Acts 1:9-11).

I can't help but think of the Apostles who travelled this road with the living Jesus, were present for his brutal execution, then travelled with Jesus after his resurrection through his appearances to them and now have to face the final chance to be with him bodily. Nothing in their history or Jewish faith had prepared them for what was occurring.

In their last encounter with Jesus they meet up with him in Bethany. (Luke 24:50) This moment with Jesus would be an important time for them. They had lost everything in the catastrophic events that preceded this, and they were on their way to discover what, if anything would be next. Matthew's Gospel begins with the disciples worshiping Jesus and being filled with doubt.

It is not unusual that we, too, struggle to make sense of the work of God in Jesus Christ. Like the disciples, we worship God, but also, like the disciples, we struggle with doubt. In spite of doubt, we have to heed these last words of Jesus as he spent this time with his disciples. He has told us directly what he expects of us, as each one of us is also his disciple. Jesus states, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Matthew 28: 18-20)

In this passage, Jesus has claimed his ultimate authority as God. Jesus sends us out into the world to “all nations.” God has reconciled himself with all of humanity. He establishes the form of Baptism in the name of the Trinity. This becomes our initiation as followers of Christ. He tells us to “observe all I have commanded you.” This is different than just following teachings. This tells us we have to live those teachings. Jesus taught service to one another and to the stranger. He served the outsider. He served the sinner. He showed preference for the vulnerable. He taught love, forgiveness and reconciliation. And just in case all of this seems to be an impossible task, Jesus promises to be with us, the Church, always, even until the end of time. This continuing, abiding presence of Jesus is a profound promise.

This Gospel moves us from the disciples' doubt and lack of understanding to focus us on the task ahead; to make disciples with teaching and baptizing as his Word expands around the world. The church is at its core to be living out the teachings of Jesus as a witness within our world. And perhaps the most astonishing thing of all, Jesus promises that his presence will be with us for all time.

**LOVE ONE ANOTHER**

Today we celebrate Christ’s Ascension into heaven and his commissioning of the disciples to carry on his mission in the world. **HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION**

Thursday, May 10th was the Ascension of the Lord, a Holy Day of Obligation. The Archdiocese has transferred the obligation to this Sunday, May 13th. In year’s past, this date was a Holy Day. It still is, but the Archdiocese of Los Angeles moves the obligation to the Sunday following the Ascension.

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

In Ireland and the United Kingdom, Mother’s Day is over. “Mothering Sunday” was on the Fourth Sunday of Lent. Long ago, people were freed from work to travel on this day to the parish where they were baptized, their “Mother Church.” Often, people were reunited with their mothers on this day. Employers would release their workers and servants for this visit. The American celebration, while based on this custom, really has to do with an anti-war movement of mothers in Civil War times. They crusaded for better sanitary conditions for their sons. When President Wilson instituted the first Mother’s Day in 1912, it was a day to fly the flag in honor of mothers whose children had died in battle. Knowing the tradition is a good balance to our celebration today. We can enfold in prayer the mothers who have suffered the loss of their children in war.

**DID YOU KNOW?**

**Know the signs of abuse and talk to your children about them.**

Some signs of abuse are too obvious to hide. Unexplained bruises and injuries may indicate abuse at home, and children who are close to a victim may notice these injuries more quickly than an adult, because they spend more time together. Children also share secrets with each other, and if a child is being abused, he/she may be more comfortable confiding in a close friend than an adult.
