



Saint John Neuman, Father of Catholic Schools / Corpus Christi

John Neumann was the first United States Bishop to be canonized a Saint. On this day, the Feast of Corpus Christi, Neumann arrived as an immigrant in New York City, with one dollar to his name and the clothes on his back.

Neumann was born in Bohemia (today the Czech Republic) in 1811. From a very young age he showed himself to be attracted to piety and scholarship. He entered the seminary in 1836, where he showed himself to be a serious student and continued his studies for the priesthood in Prague.



Because of an overabundance of priests in his diocese, the Bishop postponed all ordinations. The Saint then decided to travel to America, where priests were needed in the hope that he could be ordained there. The day after arriving in America, he found his way to the residence of Bishop Dubois, who was in desperate need of German-speaking priests. The bishop was so overjoyed at the presence of the German speaking Neumann, that he told him to begin immediately preparing for ordination. Two weeks later, on June 25, he was ordained to the priesthood. His first assignment was to the Niagara Falls area to work with recent German immigrants. He traveled the countryside—visited the sick, taught catechism, and trained teachers to take over when he left.

In 1840, with Dubois' permission, Neumann applied to join the Redemptorist Fathers, was accepted, and entered their novitiate in Pittsburgh. He took his religious vows in January 1842. He was naturalized as a United States citizen in 1848. In 1852, he was appointed Bishop of Philadelphia.

Neumann became the first bishop in the country to organize a diocesan school system, as the Catholic parents wanted their children taught in the Catholic tradition. Under his administration, the number of parochial schools in his diocese increased from 1 to 200. He is known today as the Father of Catholic Schools.

Neumann actively invited religious institutes to establish new houses within the diocese to provide necessary social services. In 1855, Neumann supported the foundation of a congregation of religious sisters in the city, the Sisters of St. Francis of Philadelphia. He brought the School Sisters of Notre Dame from Germany to assist in religious instruction and staff an orphanage. He also intervened to save the Oblate Sisters of Providence from dissolution; this congregation of African-American women was founded by Haitian refugees in Baltimore.

The large diocese was not wealthy, and Neumann became known for his personal frugality. He kept and wore only one pair of boots throughout his residence in the United States. While doing errands on January 5, 1860, Neumann collapsed and died on a Philadelphia street. He was 48 years old.

Bishop John Neumann was canonized by Pope Paul VI on June 19, 1977. His feast days are January 5th in the United States and March 5th in the Czech Republic.

Deacons are ordained clergy, upon whom hands are imposed “not unto the priesthood, but unto a ministry of service.” For strengthened by sacramental grace, in communion with the bishop and his group of priests they serve in the diaconate of the liturgy, of the word, and of charity to the people of God. (*Lumen Gentium, 29*).

The permanent deacon brings a unique pastoral presence to the parish community. He is an ordained minister whose ministry is “service sacramentalized” through the proclamation of the Gospel, through his participation in liturgy, and through his dedication to ministries of charity and justice.



Helping children problem solve through communication.

Often the easiest response to complicated conversations is a generic one, but these moments can be opportunities to help children grow. For example, if a child comes to you and tells you that a friend is being left out of social activities, you might respond with a question: "Do you think there is anything you can do help him/her feel more included?" Or if your child comes to you for money for social activities, instead of offering a solution, you might prompt them to consider ways that they could earn money or fundraise on their own. In this way, you are not only helping a child find a solution to an immediate situation, but also helping them to grow in wisdom and prudence.
