Going to Mass is Good for Your Health.

A mother went to wake her son for church one Sunday morning. When she knocked on his door, he said, "I'm not going!" "Why not?" asked his mother. "I'll give you two good reasons," he said. "One, I'm too tired. Two, I want to watch the game on TV." His mother replied, "I'll give you two good reasons why YOU WILL go to church. One, you're 47 years old. Two, you're the pastor!"

Each of us sometimes doesn't want to go to Church on Sunday. And like most things worth doing, it takes commitment and effort to follow through. Marriage is hard work, and yet, by staying married you get a lifelong partner with whom to share your life. Raising a child is hard work. But when that child graduates from school and he or she picks up that diploma a real sense of satisfaction settles in knowing you had a hand in that success. And, when attending Mass, you receive grace; grace that helps in a very real way with daily life.

One of the most striking scientific discoveries about religion in recent years is that going to church weekly is good for you. Religious attendance boosts the immune system and decreases blood pressure. It may add as much as two to three years to your life. The reason for this is not entirely clear.

Social support is no doubt part of the story. Church is not something that we do individually it is something that we do collectively. A study conducted in North Carolina found that frequent churchgoers had larger social networks, with more contacts and more kinds of social support than their unchurched counterparts. And we know that social support is directly tied to better health.



Healthy behavior is no doubt another part. Certainly many churchgoers struggle with behaviors they would like to change, but on average, regular church attendees drink less, smoke less, use fewer recreational drugs and are less sexually promiscuous than others.

Yet I think there may be another factor. Faith demands that you experience the world as more than just what is material and observable. Persons of faith experience something that is greater than they are. And that can result in a transcendent experience, one where you connect with God, and you feel the hand of God touching you.

So, come to Church every Sunday and take advantage of a prescription for good mental and physical health.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The cathedral is a treasure in a diocese and in our tradition. It is not simply a “big church,” as some say; some parish churches are larger. What makes a cathedral is the presence of the chair, called a *cathedra* (Latin for seat) reserved for the bishop.

There are many instances in our country of a local church (diocese) outgrowing a cathedral. In Baltimore and St. Louis, the former cathedrals are historic treasures in the heart of the old city, but new and larger structures now function as the seat of the bishop.

When a bishop dies or retires, it is said that “the seat is vacant,” and when the new bishop is installed, the central ritual is the moment when the decree of the Holy Father is read and the new bishop is escorted to the *cathedra*. No one but the bishop sits in the *cathedra* during a ritual, but in Los Angeles the *cathedra* in the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels is accessible, and no one seems to mind when a visitor tries the *cathedra* out for the bishop’s point of view.





Talk to Your Kids About Handling Workplace Violence.

Many teens will get their first job while still in high school. Building a work ethic is a great and necessary skill, but teens need to be informed about how best to handle possible workplace violence. Coworkers are not always thoroughly screened, and your teen could face another employee's rage or anger that could possibly put them in danger. Talk to your teens about warning signs—short tempers, intimidation, drug use—and about how to remove themselves when they feel unsafe in a situation, and how to report any concerns they have, to a safe adult. 


