## St. Kateri Tekakwitha the Lily of the Mohawks

July 14 is the feast day of Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, the first Native American to be canonized by the Roman Catholic Church. Known as the "**Lily of the Mohawks**", Kateri was born in 1656 in Auriesville, NY in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon. Her father was a Mohawk chief who had captured her catholic Algonquin mother during one of the frequent raids on the northern tribe.

When Kateri was four years old the Mohawk village where she lived was ravaged by a smallpox epidemic which took from her both of her parents as well as her younger brother. Kateri also contracted the disease which left her face scarred with pockmarks and caused her eyes to become sensitive to bright light. Thus when Kateri left her longhouse during the daylight hours she had to "feel" with her hands in order for her to navigate where she was going. Thus she received the name "Tekakwitha" which in the Mohawk language means "She who feels". After the death of her parents, Kateri lived with her uncle, who had become the new chief and her aunt.

French Jesuits, whom the Mohawks called "Black Robes" because of the black cassock they wore, would visit the village where Kateri lived. In secret, as her uncle was against her becoming a Christian, Kateri would meet with the priest who taught her about Jesus and catechized her in the catholic faith. At the age of 19 Kateri was baptized and became a catholic, taking the name "Kateri" after her patron, St. Catherine of Sienna.

Kateri's uncle and aunt wanted her to marry a young Mohawk brave but Kateri, who was very devout, wanted to take a vow of chastity to pledge herself only to Jesus Christ and belong to Him by a private consecration. She wanted no human spouse but wanted only to be married to Jesus Christ.

Due to the pressure to marry and to avoid persecution from her uncle, Kateri escaped and traveled north to a catholic Indian community near Montreal on the banks of the St. Lawrence River. The journey was very dangerous over rough mountain terrain and Kateri's uncle had sent a hunting party of Mohawk braves out to find Kateri and bring her back.

Kateri safely reached Indian Catholic settlement of Kahnawake, where she was known for her piety, penance and mystical prayer life. She would spend long hours praying in the forest in front of a large cross she herself had crafted. She often prayed for the conversion of her fellow Mohawks which she joined to fasting and other self-mortifications. On the Feast of the Annunciation, on March 25, 1679, in the presence of a Jesuit priest, Kateri made her vow of perpetual virginity to Jesus Christ to belong forever to her Divine Spouse.

Just five years after her conversion, on Easter Sunday on April 25, 1680, Kateri died after a period of illness at the age of 24. The pockmarks which once scarred her face miraculously disappeared at the moment of her death, which was attested by the priest who was with her who said her face in an instant became beautiful and fair.

Kateri Tekakwitha was beatified by Pope St. John Paul II in 1980 and canonized a saint of the Roman Catholic Church by Pope Benedict XVI on October 21, 2012. She was the patroness of World Youth Day in Toronto, Canada, in 2002 and is the patron saint of ecology and the environment, orphans, Native Americans, and people ridiculed for their piety.

Kateri is a model of faith in our own times in showing us how with faith in Christ we can persevere no matter what calamities or trials we may experience. She overcame every obstacle by submitting herself entirely to Jesus Christ. She is also a model for young people who are striving to live a holy and chase life, especially without the guidance of parents. St. Kateri's last words were, "Jesou Konoronhkwa", which translates, "Jesus, I love You."

**OBSTACLES**

The prophet Ezekiel, Saint Paul, and the Lord Jesus share something in common in today’s scripture readings. They all experience obstacles to their ministry. Ezekiel is summoned to prophesy to the Israelites, who are “[h]ard of face and obstinate of heart” (Ezekiel 2:4). Saint Paul recounts how he has been given a “thorn in the flesh” (2 Corinthians 12:7). The Lord Jesus is unable to perform many signs in his native place. The Gospel tells us that “[he] was amazed at their lack of faith” (Mark 6:6). We too sometimes encounter obstacles as we travel along the journey of faith. So often we experience weakness on this journey. Let the words of the Lord to Saint Paul encourage us today: “My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness” (2 Corinthians 12:9).

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Last week’s Treasure mentioned the “Nuns of the Battlefield,” religious sisters from several communities who served as nurses in the Civil War. Florence Nightingale had only instituted female nurses a decade before in the Crimean War, so the idea of women tending to wounded soldiers was extraordinary. The medical and sanitary conditions on the battlefields were appalling, and the sisters were nearly all teachers. Few had any medical training beyond what they had learned as youngsters in the family. Anti-Catholic prejudice was so deeply entrenched in America that sisters could not wear their habits in public. These sisters were the first, and people on both the Union and Confederate sides soon began to marvel at their bravery, efficiency, and respect for Protestant soldiers. More than six hundred sisters from twenty-one communities went to war, serving in wretched conditions. They were tough and single-minded, efficient and fearless.

After the war, sisters could appear in public everywhere in the reunited nation, and often received the praise and gratitude of grateful soldiers and family members on behalf of their sister nurses. An outdoor monument to the “Nuns of the Battlefield” stands in Washington at M Street and Rhode Island Avenue. The inscription reads: “They comforted the dying, nursed the wounded, carried hope to the imprisoned, gave in His name a drink of water to the thirsty.”



**ST. BENEDICT FEAST DAY—JULY 11th**

*O God, who made the Abbot Saint Benedict an outstanding master in the school of divine service, grant, we pray, that, putting nothing before love of you, we may hasten with a loving heart in the way of your commands. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.*

Born in Nursia, Italy, in about 480, he was educated in Rome, was repelled by the vices of the city, thirty miles away. He decided to live the life of a hermit and settled at mountainous Subiaco, where he lived in a cave for three years, fed by a monk named Romanus.



Despite Benedict’s desire for solitude, his holiness and austerities became known and he was asked to be their abbot by a community of monks at Vicovaro. He accepted, but when the monks resisted his strict rule and tried to poison him, he returned to Subiaco and soon attracted great numbers of disciples. He organized them into twelve monasteries under individual priors he appointed, made manual work part of the program, and soon Subiaco became a center of spirituality and learning. He left suddenly, reportedly because of the efforts of a neighboring priest, Florentius, to undermine his work, and in about 525 settled at Monte Cassino.

He destroyed a pagan temple to Apollo on its crest, brought the people of the neighboring area back to Christianity, and in about 530 began to build the monastery that was to be the birthplace of Western monasticism. Soon disciples again flocked to him as his reputation for holiness, wisdom, and miracles spread far and wide. He organized the monks into a single monastic community and wrote his famous rule prescribing common sense, a life of moderate asceticism, prayer, study, and work, and community life under one superior. It stressed obedience, stability, zeal, and had the Divine Office as the center of monastic life; it was to affect spiritual and monastic life in the West for centuries to come.



While ruling his monks (most of whom, including Benedict, were not ordained), he counseled rulers and Popes, ministered to the poor and destitute about him, and tried to repair the ravages of the Lombard Totila’s invasion. He died at Monte Cassino on March 21, 547.

**DID YOU KNOW?**

**Go beyond just saying “no” to teach children about polite exceptions.**

Rules about politeness seem to be in contradiction to the rules we teach children about avoiding predators and responding to behaviors that make them uncomfortable. It’s important to expand on the idea of saying “no” when someone asks them to cross a boundary. Explain that there are situations where being rude is acceptable, if that’s what it takes, and help them understand that being polite has its limits. **TIPS TO PRAY THE ROSARY EVERY DAY**

- Fall asleep praying the Rosary. It is better than counting sheep.
- Say it in moments of sadness or spiritual drought.
- If you can't pray a whole Rosary at once, break it into parts.
- Carry a Rosary in your pocket.
- Say it while you wait (for example, at the bus stop).
- Use each mystery to ask for a particular intention.
- Pray while you walk and think of the people in your life.
- Recite the Rosary while doing chores or while you work out.
- Use images and music. The Rosary is a contemplative prayer.
- If you're upset, pray for the situation that worries you.
