November, a Month of Souls

As the holidays approach, it is normal that we turn our thoughts to our loved ones who are no longer among us. For many, the holiday season is tinged with a bit of sadness. I appreciate that the Church gives us the "Month of Souls" in November, the last month of the liturgical calendar, to give us a space to honor and mourn the departed. I offer this quote from St. Teresa of Calcutta:

"November begins with two beautiful days, **the Feasts of All Saints and All Souls**. Holy Mother Church remembers all of her children, to whom she has given the life of Jesus through Baptism ... We all know that during this whole month we give them extra love and care, by praying to them and for them."

Pope Benedict XVI compared heaven and purgatory as a "botanical garden, where one is amazed by the variety of plants and flowers, and often one is drawn to think of the imagination of the Creator who has given the earth a wonderful garden."

When we think of the Saints, one can't help by being struck by the diversity of those who have been canonized. These Saints are of every age and social condition, of every language and culture. Each one is different from the other, each unique in his/her own personality and spiritual charism. However, each responded to the call of Jesus, to follow him in his words and deeds, some even giving up their lives faithful to the call. They embraced the cross of Jesus, shouldering their own share of sacrifice to participate in the glory of the Resurrection. Knowing we walk in the company of Saints, they can help us conquer fear and tribulation. That is why we pray to them.



We also pray to and ask for prayers from those who have died but fell short of sainthood. While we may know some people who appear to be Saints here on Earth, most of us will spend some time in Purgatory, a doctrine of the Church which is sorely misunderstood. Purgatory is not some last "test" that the faithful must "pass." Rather, think of it as the space and time to become reconciled with our human failures, our inability to achieve true forgiveness for wrongs that we had to bear or atonement for the wrongs we perpetrated. We know that all souls in Purgatory will one day enjoy everlasting, joyful life with our Lord! So, we pray for them. And, since we know they will eventually be in the Heavenly Kingdom, we ask them to pray for us.

I urge each of you to make a daily prayer to Saints and Souls each day this month. Go to mass with an intention for a particular Soul or Saint. It will be very comforting to you as you approach the Holidays this fall.

THE HOPE AND PROMISE OF REDEMPTION

God’s laws are not intended to burden or torment us. Instead they are guideposts that point us in the direction of good living. Accordingly, good living requires loving God and loving one another. We should not follow God’s laws out of fear of what might happen if we don’t, but rather view them as a foundation for building relationships and trust with one another and with God.

The *Shema* prayer of Orthodox Jews is based on the reading from Deuteronomy today, “Hear, O Israel.” Every morning people recite the prayer as a profession of their love for God and pledge their obedience to God throughout the day. They pass on their love of God to their children, from one generation to the next.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Just two years ago, we engaged in one of the core activities of our democratic system: a presidential election. Actually, the institution of election can be traced to traditions in the Church, and although bishops are no longer chosen in this way, abbots and abbesses (heads of monastic communities) have almost always been elected by full voting members of their communities. The lifetime appointment begins when the monks or nuns are gathered in “chapter” at the death or resignation of the abbot, and fortunately for all involved, campaigning is not allowed! The members of the community discern, with prayer to the Holy Spirit, who among them is the best suited for leadership. Once chosen, the new leader requests the blessing of the local bishop, who usually presides at a ceremony of consecration or investiture. The ballots are always secret, and a simple majority must be achieved.

In our American system the Electoral College is the determining voice in the presidential election, not the popular election on a November Tuesday, just as the monastic chapter is the electorate. Today, most religious orders elect general superiors in “chapter” by delegates of the professed members, and usually for a term of six years. A few, like the Jesuits, elect for life. At least we don’t have that weight on our shoulders when we choose a president. Four years at a time will do!

OPEN HOUSE DON BOSCO TECH



WHAT IS THIS?

Have you ever wondered what something was called, or if there is a proper name for something you’ve seen in the church?

- **Nave** - The main body of a church building.
- **Crucifix** - A cross with the image of Christ on it. The crucifix is located behind the altar in the church.
- **Pew** - The bench where people sit in church.
- **Stations** - Fourteen (14) pictures or sculptures usually along the walls of the church depicting Christ’s passion and death.
- **Lectern** - The stand or reading table from which the cantor leads the singing. Sometimes announcements or prayers are also led from here.
