Baptism of the Lord

Today marks the end of the Christmas Season. From Luke's account of the birth of Jesus, to the visitation of the three Kings, Jesus at the age of twelve going to the Temple to listen to the Rabbis and asking astute questions, to the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist, we have been travelling along with Jesus as he grew from an infant, to a young man, to the beginning of his public ministry.

Throughout the Gospels, we have been invited to reflect on the various comings of Christ in our world. As we reflect, we need to open ourselves to the grace our own encounters with the living Christ has brought about. In today's Gospel, Jesus, as an adult and along with the other people gathered at the site, receives the water of John's baptism. To understand the magnitude of this act, it helps if we put ourselves into the period this occurred. First of all, the people gathered were followers of John the Baptist, or had heard about him and wanted to witness him. Many thought John was the promised Messiah, God's anointed one. John answers this by saying that "one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." It wasn't until everyone was baptized that the heavens opened, and the Holy Spirit descended as a dove and God the Father was heard by the people present expressing his pleasure in the Son.



Throughout the Acts of the Apostles, the presence of the Holy Spirit is marked by tongues of fire. Water is used for washing; fire provides light. Both elements figure prominently in our Catholic sacraments. John's statement was a foreshadowing of Jesus' coming ministry.

In the first reading from Isaiah, he proclaims the Lord's pleasure at his chosen servant, upon whom he put his spirit. This servant has been called to bring justice to the nations. He is not going to do this by shouting. He will be so humble he will not break a bruised reed or put out a smoldering wick. Jesus is to bring forth justice, sensitively and without fanfare; to be a light to the peoples; to open the eyes of the blind and to set the captives free.

When we are baptized in Christ, we too are called to the same mission as Jesus and the same sensitive approach to the mission. The fire in our hearts sometimes flickers in the face of life's challenges. We are sometimes guilty of crushing "the bruised reed" or extinguishing the flickering flame of hope.

Tomorrow, we move into Ordinary Time. Maybe this would be a good time to think about stirring those embers and fanning the flame of God's love that we received at our baptism so that justice might prevail in our world and on our planet - justice without violence, if not without pain.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Merry Christmas! Share that cheerful greeting with some folks today. They may wonder if you have had any Elvis sightings lately, attended Star Trekkie conventions, or were Cleopatra in a previous lifetime. Despite the skeptics, today is solidly within the Christmas season. In fact, in some strands of the Christian tradition it represents the clearest manifestation of the mystery of the Incarnation. On Christmas Day, for example, the Gospel reading is the Prologue of John’s Gospel, which reveals the glory of Christ shining through our humanity precisely in his baptism.

At any rate, this is an ancient feast, celebrated first in Egypt sixteen centuries ago. More than most other ancient people, the Egyptians understood the life giving properties of water. On this day, they drew water from the Nile, so central in the history of their people, and reserved in honor. Many other places copied the custom, so that St. John Chrysostom wrote of people in Antioch gathering at midnight to collect flowing water into vessels they brought from home since “today there is a blessing on the water.” At home for dinner tonight, decorate the table with beautiful bowls of water and white candles, toast one another with goblets of sparkling water, and light a Christmas candle in the window one last time.


January is the Month of the Holy Name.
