Five Reasons to be Married

In celebration of World Marriage this week's
Pastor's Corner is a reprint from 2018.



One of my privileges as a Priest is I am called to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage. In addition, I celebrate Anniversary Masses for couples who have been married for instance 25, 50 or 60 years. I am in awe of those of you that have been and stayed married for many, many years. It is a testimony to the grace God has bestowed on these two people and they have responded to that grace.



However, we know that Catholic marriages are in decline. Some young couples are getting married in secular settings, or forgoing marriage altogether and cohabit with one another. So, I want to share 5 reasons why marriage is so important.

If you are married, you may have discovered why marriage is so important and experienced some of the good that comes from it. Or, maybe marriage was hard for some of you and you're no longer married. However, there is hope.

God has created marriage to reveal more about Him and how awesome He is. And this is revealed through many of His purposes for marriage.

Here are 5 reasons that explain the importance of the Sacrament of Marriage:

1. **Beginning:** Marriage is the beginning—the beginning of the family—and is a life-long commitment. It also provides an opportunity to grow in selflessness as you serve your spouse and children. Marriage is more than a physical union; it is also a spiritual and emotional union. This union mirrors the one between God and His Church.
2. **Oneness:** When a man and woman get married, the “two become one.” Marriage is a bond like no other. It gives you a life partner, a teammate, as you move through the challenges of life together.
3. **Purity:** Marriage is designed for purity. We are under assault by temptation often and from many directions. The bond of marriage gives support to defeat these temptations by engaging in deep, satisfying love—a love that gives to, and receives from, your mate physically, emotionally, and spiritually.
4. **Parenting:** When a marriage produces a child or receives a child through adoption, it is one of life's greatest blessings. Roughly 40% of children being raised today are in a home without a father. The effects of that fact are staggering. But when children are raised in a healthy marriage, they get a front row seat to see and experience the lasting benefits of strong family.
5. **Love:** Marriage is designed to mirror our Creator's unconditional love for us. It's a love that will always be there and will never leave us or forsake us. When a man and woman love one another with that unconditional love, contentment follows, and joy abounds.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The Reign of God comes about because people commit to reversing their lives completely, to embracing new vision, new values. Many popular television shows exploit an unattractive side of human nature by pitting contestants against one another, even to the point of performing dangerous stunts or devious schemes, to gain money or favor.

At the liturgy, we counter that impulse by committing ourselves to live generously. In response to Christ’s total gift, we offer bread and wine as the emblems of our lives, our hopes, our joys and sorrows. The bread and wine carried to the altar contain our lives, and by offering our lives to God, we prepare to receive the gift of God’s own life. We are to become what we receive: the body of Christ.

On Sundays, this self giving is often accompanied by a collection and procession of gifts for the poor and money for the upkeep of the parish. There are certainly other methods of collecting money, some perhaps more efficient. Yet the act of giving from our abundance, and attending to the needs of the poor, opens us up to participation in the changes the Reign of God requires. —James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

Confronted with God’s power and majesty, the first response of the prophet Isaiah was to acknowledge his sinfulness. “Woe is me, I am doomed! For I am a man of unclean lips,” he said aloud. Likewise, with his empty fishing nets dramatically filled at Jesus’ instruction, Peter fell to his knees and cried out, “Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man.”

Next, Peter got up. He docked his boats then left to follow Jesus. Isaiah also had a dramatic change of heart. When he heard the Lord say, “Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?” Isaiah answered, “Here I am, send me.”

We are summoned daily by the Risen Lord. We are reminded of the saving power of the gospel and know in our heart of hearts that, as St. Paul wrote, believing in anything else won’t lead to anything.

What will it take for you to move past your sinfulness? What will it take for you to get off your knees? What will it take for you to bring to dock what is unimportant and to accept your call to be God’s messenger?


Please join us! The St. Louise Book Group is reading *"Ten Years Gone"* by Jonathan Dunsky.
