OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL AND THE BROWN SCAPULAR

The feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel was celebrated on **July 16** and commemorated the title of Our Lady in association to the Carmelite Order, Mount Carmel and the Brown Scapular. Mount Carmel is a holy mountain overlooking the Mediterranean Sea near Haifa in Israel. It is the Mountain that the prophet Elijah took refuge after he faced the priests of the false god Baal and brought the people of Israel back to the true God. Since the 12th century Carmelite monks have held Mt. Carmel as a holy place of prayer and contemplation and built monasteries and hermitages. The monks hold the Blessed Virgin Mary as the inspiration and model of their monastic life and honor her by the title of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

It is held that Our Lady appeared to St. Simon Stock at the Carmelite Priory on July 16, 1251. Our Lady gave St. Simon a brown scapular for the Carmelites with the following promise, saying, "Receive, My beloved son, this habit of thy order: this shall be to thee and to all Carmelites a privilege, that whosoever dies clothed in this shall never suffer eternal fire...It shall be a sign of salvation, a protection in danger, and of pledge of peace."

Another important aspect of wearing the Scapular is the Sabbatine Privilege. This concerns a promise made by Our Lady to Pope John XXII. In a papal letter he issued, he recounted a vision that he had had. He stated that the Blessed Virgin had said to him in this vision, concerning those who wear the Brown Scapular: "I, the Mother of Grace, shall descend on the Saturday after their death and whomsoever I shall find in Purgatory, I shall free, so that I may lead them to the holy mountain of life everlasting."

Many popes and saints have strongly recommended wearing the Brown Scapular to the Catholic Faithful. In his message to the Carmelites at the 750th anniversary of the bestowal of the Brown Scapular, Pope St. John Paul II said those who wear the scapular dedicated themselves to the service of Our Lady for the good of the whole church with the words: "Two truths are evoked by the sign of the Scapular: on the one hand, the constant protection of the Blessed Virgin, not only on life's journey, but also at the moment of passing into the fullness of eternal glory; on the other, the awareness that devotion to her cannot be limited to prayers and tributes in her honor on certain occasions, but must become a "habit", that is, a permanent orientation of one's own Christian conduct, woven of prayer and interior life, through frequent reception of the sacraments and the concrete practice of the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. In this way the Scapular becomes a sign of the "covenant" and reciprocal communion between Mary and the faithful: indeed, it concretely translates the gift of his Mother, which Jesus gave on the Cross to John and, through him, to all of us, and the entrustment of the beloved Apostle and of us to her, who became our spiritual Mother."

According to Church tradition, there are three conditions necessary to participate in the privilege and share in the other spiritual benefits of the Scapular: wear the Brown Scapular, observe chastity according to your state in life, and pray the Rosary. In addition to the Sabbatine Privilege, enrollment in the Brown Scapular also makes a person part of the Carmelite family throughout the world. They therefore share in all of the prayers and good works of the Carmelite Orders.

In order to receive the spiritual blessings associated with the Scapular, it is necessary to be formally enrolled in the Brown Scapular. The enrollment is made only once by a priest. Once a person is enrolled, when they need to replace their scapular they need only put a new one on, the blessing and enrollment continue. The old scapular should be buried or burned as it is a blessed object. St. John Vianney was a great promoter of the Brown Scapular.

In 1845, the English ship, King of the Ocean, was lashed by a wild hurricane. The Rev. Fisher, a Protestant minister, together with his wife and children and other passengers, struggled to the deck to pray for mercy and forgiveness as the end seemed at hand. Among the crew was a young Irishman, John McAuliffe. He opened his shirt—took off his Scapular—made the Sign of the Cross over the angry waves, then threw the Scapular into the ocean. At that very moment the wind calmed, only one more wave washed over the deck, bringing with it the Scapular which landed at the boy's feet. The Rev. Fisher and his family had observed what he had done. They questioned the boy. He told them about the Virgin and Her Scapular and Her Promise of protection in time of danger. So impressed were they that they determined to enter the Church and enjoy a like protection.

The Brown Scapular is a sacramental of grace and a sign of the protection of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of consecration to her. As such the wearer must strive to cultivate the life of grace and imitation of the virtues of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Brown Scapulars are available at most Catholic gift shops and online.

Keeping Sunday holy is a good habit to cultivate in these days when our spirits are especially receptive to God’s deep desire for us to know divine love.



GOING, GOING, GONE!

Young people are leaving the Catholic faith in greater numbers than ever. In 2018, Saint Mary’s Press published their research on **why** these young people are leaving the faith and titled the work *Going, Going, Gone: The Disaffiliation in Young Catholics*. The results of an unprecedented two-year national study offers compelling and sometimes disturbing insight into the reasons why young people are leaving the Catholic Church and religion in general.

“The reasons most adults think young people leave the church are not the reasons young people leave the church,” said John Vitek, Saint Mary’s Press president and CEO. “There are so many assumptions made by adults that are simply not accurate. When you hear a young person tell their story in their own words, it’s really instructive and clarifying. Clarity, accurateness, and truth open the doors to authentic insight and understanding.”

Today, **July 20th and July 21st**, there will be a special collection for the National Needs Combined Collection.



TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — Abraham shows hospitality to three visitors (Genesis 18:1-10a).

Psalm — He who does justice will live in the presence of the Lord (Psalm 15).

Second Reading — The mystery hidden from generations past has been manifested; it is Christ in you, the hope for glory (Colossians 1:24-28).

Gospel — Jesus converses with Martha and Mary about service and contemplation (Luke 10:38-42).

DID YOU KNOW?

Drug use prevention starts at home.

You know it's important to keep your children, especially teenagers, away from drugs, but besides lecturing, how can you impress this importance on your children? Setting an example at home is a great start — watch how you communicate subtle messages about your own substance use, such as a glass of wine after a "hard day" or overdoing it on prescription medication. Additionally, talk to your children about drug-related rules in real contexts, like parties. Give them realistic scripts for saying no if friends offer them drugs, so they have real options when the time comes.
