



From St. Francis to Pope Francis

On Saturday, October 4th, we celebrated the Feast Day of St. Francis of Assisi. He is an amazing saint; a champion of the poor and all of creation. A song of praise to Brother Sun and Sister Moon, and the beauty of all God's creation ... these are the words of St. Francis of Assisi penned in "The Canticle of Creation," composed almost 800 years ago.

When Cardinal Jorge Bergoglio took the name of Francis in 2013 after being elected Pope, many people were startled. He already was a bundle of firsts: The first Pope from South America, the first Jesuit. And now he was the first to take the name Francis. He could have taken a name from a Saint of South America: St. Peter Claver was both a Jesuit priest and a Columbian or St. Alberto Hurtado, also a Jesuit priest and from Peru. He could have chosen a name from among one of the many notable Jesuit priests, including St. Ignatius of Loyola. But instead he chose the name of Francis.

Pope Francis chose the name, he says, at the point of receiving the number of votes to be elected Pope when his friend, Cardinal Hummes "hugged me, kissed me and said, 'Don't forget the poor. 'He took to heart the words of his friend and chose to be called after St. Francis of Assisi, "the man of poverty, the man of peace, the man who loves and protects creation," the same created world "with which we don't have such a good relationship... How I would like a church that is poor and that is for the poor." John Allen, CNN Vatican correspondent said, "[the name symbolizes] poverty, humility, simplicity and rebuilding the Catholic Church. The new pope is sending a signal that this will not be business as usual."



St. Francis was rich, he was spoiled, he had everything he could possibly desire. Inside, he had nothing. One day, around the age of 25, he made a decision: 'I'm giving everything away, including my will. I'm giving it all to the Lord.' Francis heard God call him to 'rebuild my church, for it is in ruins,' and dedicated his life to living just as Jesus had.

Throughout his life Francis sought communion with God in a hermitage outside of Assisi. The hermitage was a place of calm, of peace. Staying here and praying here inside the caves, among roots with birds and with animals, Francis understood that God is the creator of everybody and everything. The Saint embraced Jesus' teaching that if you serve other people, you discover peace; you will discover happiness.

Pope Francis symbolically, through a name, has made it clear that he has a special place in his heart and his ministry for the poor, for the disenfranchised, and for those living on the fringes and facing injustice.

In December 2016, Francis Rocca, Wall Street Journalist covering the Vatican, said about the Pope "He's been very, very clear he has a certain agenda in the political and economic areas," he said. "For example, on climate change, he has grabbed that in a very, very, very aggressive way... [And] the pope basically favors open borders -- not only for refugees but also for economic migrants." For some Americans, these messages have been hard to hear. But I think St. Francis would understand.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Sometimes human relationships go awry, but Christ’s choice for us is irrevocable. In marriage celebrations, the Church always recalls God’s faithfulness to help prepare married couples for enduring the inevitable rough spots. The Byzantine liturgy does this by adorning the couple with crowns that remind them of the martyr’s crown. The couple therefore takes on a vocation of witnessing to the sacredness of life in all of its suffering and joy, and of keeping their eyes fixed on the banquet of heaven.

In Eastern theology, people have a liturgical vocation to give God praise, and marriage fits within that plan. It is not so much saying prayers that counts, but becoming prayer. Interestingly, in this liturgy the couple never utters a word other than joining in the community’s chants; there are no marriage vows as such. There is therefore not a hint of our Western Christian sense that marriage is a legal contract. Rather, it is all about living out one’s baptismal vocation, embracing the cross, pouring oneself out in love, and opening to the grace of the Holy Spirit.

A LITTLE FAITH

Today our readings are about faith, frustration, and how much is enough. Habakkuk is a complainer having an argument with God. Timothy is encouraging a community challenged by cowardice and the apostles want more faith than they have. Things aren’t happening fast enough for any of them or for us. All of them and we want God to do something sooner rather than later want God to give us a reason to believe that it will all work out. What does God do? God puts it back on them—and us—telling Habakkuk to describe the world he wants; telling the apostles to do more than the expected. Doing more with less is a familiar phrase today and a reminder that a little faith may be enough even for the most difficult times.

EUCHARISTIC MINISTER TRAINING

Are you being called by God to serve in His Church as a Eucharistic Minister of Holy Communion? If so, St. Louise will have a Eucharistic Minister training on **Thursday, November 14th and Thursday, November 21st from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm in the Church**. You must attend both sessions. This is an open invitation for you to come with an open heart for an evening of prayer, discerning God's call for you. A Eucharistic Minister distributes Holy Communion at the regularly scheduled weekday and/or weekend Masses. They may also assist in ministering to the homebound parishioners, those in hospitals and in nursing facilities.



The guidelines for this ministry:

- You must be a fully initiated Catholic. (Baptized, First Holy Communion, and Confirmed).
- You must be at least 18 years of age (Confirmed High School students for the 5:00 pm Sunday Mass only).

Those entering into this ministry should be persons who sincerely try to live the Gospel message in their communal and individual lives.

They should faithfully participate in the Sunday Eucharist and with God's grace strive to live their faith in every aspect of their lives. CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Two new air conditioning units for the church, a new hall HVAC unit and a hall kitchen makeup air unit were delivered last week. The air conditioning unit for the choir loft was previously installed when the old church units were removed.

The contractors have been working to upgrades and modifications in the mechanical service area (the roof above the Sacristy). Because of changes in design of air conditioning units in the last 50 years, modifications were necessary to accommodate the footprint of the new units.

This upcoming week the HVAC units will be connected and tested to make sure they are running well. If all goes well, the Church could be using the new air conditioners on the weekend of Sunday, October 13th and the temporary air conditioning will be removed.

This does not mean that work is concluded. We are using this opportunity to update the Sacristy as well. This is the first renovation to this facility in 45 years. Updates are being made to create a more user friendly space to include new cabinetry, painting, flooring and updates to conform with Safeguard the Children recommendations.

Roofing for both the church and the hall are also being addressed as part of this project. That work is underway and we hope to have watertight roofs before the winter rains arrive.

We appreciate everyone's patience and support. Please pray for a successful project. If all goes well, we hope to be moved back in to the Sacristy in November.



DID YOU KNOW?

The Archdiocese is participating in an Independent Compensation Program for Victim-Survivors of Sexual Abuse of Minors by Priests.

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles, along with five other dioceses in California, is participating in an independent program to offer persons who were victims of abuse as minors by diocesan priests, access to compensation as well as access to counseling services if they chose. Those harmed many years ago and barred from filing lawsuits because of civil statutes of limitations will be eligible to make claims under the Independent Compensation Program for Victim-Survivors of Sexual Abuse of Minors by Priests. The Archdiocese's participation in the program is part of a long-standing commitment to supporting and compensating victims of abuse, the protection of children and the vulnerable, and the prevention of abuse and misconduct in Catholic parishes, schools and ministries. Nationally recognized mediators and private compensation program administrators, Kenneth R. Feinberg and Camille S. Biros will administer the program. Funding for the program in our Archdiocese will come from self-insured reserves, monies set aside for this purpose. We pray that this new program might provide another avenue toward healing and hope. 
