

## Keeping the Third Commandment

One of the responsibilities of a Pastor is to evangelize. There are others: celebrate Sacraments; oversee the welfare of the Parish both financially, physically and spiritually; evangelize the Gospels and the teachings of the Catholic Church. It is this last one I wish to address today.



The third commandment tells us to keep holy the Sabbath day. Christians have designated Sunday as the Sabbath day. This is to honor the day that Christ rose from the dead. For Jews, Saturday is celebrated as the Sabbath and for Muslims, Friday. We know that one of the strictures about keeping the Sabbath as holy is to refrain from unnecessary work on that day. For some, that is not possible, you must work on Sunday. Fortunately, the Catholic Church has added an obligation to keep the Sabbath day holy, and that is all Catholics are obliged to attend Mass every week on the Sabbath. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that "You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor." The obligation is binding every Sunday. It is a holy day of obligation, a day for you to grow in your faith. Except in unusual circumstances, this should be possible for all of us since there are so many offerings of times when we can attend. Here, at St. Louise, you can attend a vigil Mass on Saturday or many times during Sunday including a Sunday evening Mass.

Why is Mass so important? First and foremost, it is the place where we celebrate Eucharist; the transformation of bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ. We remember that Jesus showed us how to do this at the Last Supper when he told his Apostles, "Do this in memory of me." Every time you attend Mass, you participate in remembering what was said at the Last Supper.

From the earliest days of the Church, Christians have understood that being a Christian is not a private matter. We are called to be Christians together. While we should engage in the private worship of God throughout the week, our primary form of worship is public and communal, which is another reason Sunday Mass is so important.

Finally, I want to explain what is meant by attending Mass. First, we attend the entire Mass. We should be in the Church before the Priest processes to the Sanctuary. We should stay in the Church until the Priest leaves the Sanctuary. It is rude to be late or leave early. Mass is a ritual and we need to be present and participate in the entire ritual. This should not be so challenging. Most of us must be at a job by a certain time, and we leave at a certain time. If we are chronically late to work or leave early, we risk losing your job. Mass is no less important. Second, we need to be present to the ritual. This means our electronic devices are turned off. We do not check them during Mass. Nothing is more important than what is happening on the altar. Third, we participate. We answer the responses. We sing (if you can.) Certainly, our music ministers are grateful when we do so. Finally, we go to the altar to receive Eucharist or a blessing at Communion time.

I have said this before, but parents, you are the primary teachers of your children. You need to model the behavior of a faithful Catholic Christian. You can send your child to the Church to receive Sacraments, but if you do not model the behavior expected of a Catholic Christian, your child is less likely to continue in his or her faith when he or she grows up.

For those of you who attend Church faithfully, I applaud you. For those of you who struggle in this matter, I ask that you think and pray on what you have read here.

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Although the hours of daylight are rapidly dwindling, many people would say that these October days bring the year’s most splendid weather. Americans are riders and joggers, not strollers, and so the pleasures of the season are often lost on us. This is not the case with many Jewish people, who observe an ancient rule in walking to synagogue on the Sabbath. On city streets and suburban sidewalks in many cities, we may notice around sunset the nicely dressed families walking and chatting on Friday afternoon. After a short prayer at dusk, the families stroll home again for a relaxing and festive meal. They return to synagogue in the morning, and then spend an afternoon in family leisure until three stars appear in the night sky and Sabbath ends.

Catholics, on the other hand, pile into the car and drive even a short distance to Mass; some even divide the family to participate at different hours. For Jews, the leisurely walk marks a dividing line between hectic life commitments and a day of abundant joy and enrichment. Before we became an automobile culture, Catholics embraced a similar pace, and in most places walked to church. These lovely days of fall invite us to tap into an old and life-giving tradition. If you live within a mile of your church, walk next week. If you must drive, park at a good distance and walk the rest of the way. Talk about your life, greet strangers, notice the crunch of leaves under your shoes. You may be surprised at how different Sunday Mass feels when it is framed by leisure!

**EUCHARISTIC MINISTER TRAINING**

Are you being called by God to serve in His Church as a Eucharistic Minister of Holy Communion? If so, St. Louise will have a Eucharistic Minister training on **Thursday, November 14th and Thursday, November 21st from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm in the Church.** You must attend both sessions. This is an open invitation for you to come with an open heart for an evening of prayer, discerning God's call for you. A Eucharistic Minister distributes Holy Communion at the regularly scheduled weekday and/or weekend Masses. They may also assist in ministering to the homebound parishioners, those in hospitals and in nursing facilities.

The guidelines for this ministry:

- You must be a fully initiated Catholic. (Baptized, First Holy Communion, and Confirmed).
- You must be at least 18 years of age.

Those entering into this ministry should be persons who sincerely try to live the Gospel message in their communal and individual lives.

They should faithfully participate in the Sunday Eucharist and with God's grace strive to live their faith in every aspect of their lives. 





**Know the signs of denial**

Denial is a commonly used defense mechanism for abuse victims. Because they want to believe that things will go back to normal, victims often feel trapped into just allowing the situation to play out. Fear of change can be overwhelming, especially if the victim has been manipulated by his or her abuser. Victims may also struggle with accepting what's happening because they know their abuser closely, as a family member or friend. It's important to recognize the signs of denial and how to break through those barriers that can keep a victim from true healing.
