### Zacchaeus and Radical Charitable Giving

Each year about this time, it feels as though time is rocketing towards the end of the year. From All Saints Day, throughout November into Thanksgiving Day and the beginning of Advent to Christmas and the end of the calendar year, time just seems to speed up. I want everyone to take a deep breath and take each of the remaining 58 days of 2019, one at a time.

A common reflection at the end of the year, is to begin thinking about tax preparation. Some of us look at our charitable giving to see if we have given what we thought we would give this year and how that might impact our taxes. Some of us do not make enough money to worry about tax deductions, but still, looking at how we have given back during the year is a valuable exercise.

Today's Gospel is an example of radical giving. It's kind of a funny story if you think about it. Here is this guy, a tax collector. He's described as short. He is not well liked. But like so many, he has heard about this man Jesus and he wants to see what all the fuss is about, so he climbs a tree to get a better look. Lo and behold, Jesus stops beneath the tree Zacchaeus has climbed and tells him to come down.

Zacchaeus was probably a little embarrassed. He was a rich and powerful man, and here he has been caught up in a tree! And yet he is curious. The stories told about Jesus say he heals people. He makes the lame walk, the blind see and the demons cower. Here's what's puzzling to Zacchaeus—this man, this Jesus, doesn't appear to give preference to the wealthy.

When Zacchaeus climbs down, a most extraordinary thing happens; Jesus invites himself to dinner, to the home of one of the most despised men in the town. The crowds are not happy, "He has gone to be the guest of a sinner." (Luke 19:7) Zacchaeus is overwhelmed by this compassionate gesture of Jesus. He is immediately transformed by the love of Jesus from one who extorts money from taxpayers to charitable giving to the poor. He promises 50% of all that he has will be given away to the poor and promises to pay back 4 times what he has extorted from the taxpayers.



Zacchaeus' transformation reflects God's generous nature. Each of us is called to reflect his nature, because Jesus did, and we are called to be like him. All of us who follow Christ are heirs to promises much bigger than any wealth we could possibly acquire in this life.

The Archbishop has summoned us to participate in the Called to Renew capital and endowment campaign raising \$500 million in the next 5 years to "elevate parishes; strengthen ministerial outreach; support vocations and seminarian education; and provide additional funding for scholarships to Catholic schools, religious education, and college campus ministries." We will hear more about this as this year finishes and the next one begins.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Every week, some treasures from our tradition are shared here. Where does all this history come from? The history of God’s people of prayer is always coming to light, mostly because scholars have dedicated their lives to research. They translate and ponder prayers and songs; explore the places used for worship; look at the vessels, books, and vestments; and read works from legal documents to letters and diaries. In the 1930s, Hitler’s rush to arm Germany closed seminaries as priests and seminarians alike were drafted into service.

One professor, Father Josef Jungman, forced from his classroom, spent the war years in an Austrian library. His careful work disclosed much of what we know of the history of the Mass. His great work, *The Mass of the Roman Rite*, describes the evolution of Eucharistic celebration and inspired generations of scholars to explore a tradition surprisingly rich and varied. It was said of him that he had a command of the past that cast new light on the present, and opened up a clear direction to the future. His contributions to the Second Vatican Council helped shape the way that we worship today. At the end of his life, in 1975, his studies completed, he told a friend that he was waiting patiently for the Lord’s knock at the door to take him to the heavenly banquet.

A GREAT AND GLORIOUS GOD

Our readings today ponder two powerful truths: God is infinitely greater than we are; and God provides every kind of help so we can discover and share in God’s glory. The reading from Wisdom reminds us that we are tiny compared to “the Lord of the whole universe.” Nevertheless, God preserves and nurtures us out of perfect love. If we feel tiny, weak, and sinful compared to God, we are blessed! God’s greatness sustains and strengthens us. Saint Paul encourages the Thessalonian Christians with the same message. He reminds them that God alone makes the Church holy. He prays that everything they undertake will be for the glory of God. Luke’s Gospel shows us what this looks like in real life: Zacchaeus, feeling small and excluded, looks for Jesus. Jesus finds him and gives him the strength he needs to repent of his sins and glorify God.

## EUCCHARISTIC MINISTER TRAINING

Are you being called by God to serve in His Church as a Eucharistic Minister of Holy Communion? If so, St. Louise will have a Eucharistic Minister training on **Thursday, November 14th and Thursday, November 21st from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm in the Church.** You must attend both sessions. This is an open invitation for you to come with an open heart for an evening of prayer, discerning God's call for you. A Eucharistic Minister distributes Holy Communion at the regularly scheduled weekday and/or weekend Masses. They may also assist in ministering to the homebound parishioners, those in hospitals and in nursing facilities.

The guidelines for this ministry:

- You must be a fully initiated Catholic. (Baptized, First Holy Communion, and Confirmed).
- You must be at least 18 years of age.

Those entering into this ministry should be persons who sincerely try to live the Gospel message in their communal and individual lives. They should faithfully participate in the Sunday Eucharist and with God's grace strive to live their faith in every aspect of their lives. 


## VETERAN'S DAY MASS AND RECEPTION

**Independent Compensation Program for Victim-Survivors of Abuse by Diocesan Clergy (ICP)**

As part of our long-standing commitment to provide pastoral care and to support the healing process for victim-survivors, the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, along with five other dioceses in California, is participating in the new Independent Compensation Program by the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, Diocese of Fresno, Diocese of Orange, Diocese of Sacramento, Diocese of San Bernardino, and Diocese of San Diego for Victim-Survivors of Sexual Abuse of Minors by Priests (ICP). The ICP is administered independently of the Church by Kenneth Feinberg and Camille Biros, widely recognized as premier dispute resolution administrators in the country. The program is now accepting registrations from any person who has been sexually abused as a minor by diocesan priests of the participating dioceses, no matter when that abuse might have occurred. Funding for the program in our Archdiocese will come from self-insured reserves, monies set aside for this purpose. We pray that this new program might provide another avenue toward healing and hope.
