

Prayer is a Gift of Grace

News headlines and Facebook images burst with stories of a world imploding with conflicts of ideas and moral conscious. Beyond the emotions and rhetoric heard across the airwaves, as Catholic Christians, what should be our response? Prayer.

God may be stirring you to action or calling you to quiet contemplation, but if God were telling you something would you know? If God were reassuring or challenging you would you notice? Prayer is the only way we can be assured of God's presence, grace, love and will for our lives. This is one reason why our Lord established the Church. Through her worship, her sacraments, her teachings, our prayer life is strengthened and our relationship with God secured.

Prayer is both a gift of grace and a determined response on our part. It always presupposes effort. The great figures of prayer of the Old Covenant before Christ, as well as the Mother of God, the saints, and Christ himself, all teach us this: prayer is a battle. Against whom? Against ourselves and against the wiles of the tempter who does all he can to turn us away from prayer, away from union with God. ¹

In the battle of prayer, we must face in ourselves and around us erroneous notions of prayer. Some people view prayer as a simple psychological activity, others as an effort of concentration to reach a mental void. Still others reduce prayer to ritual words and postures. Many Christians unconsciously regard prayer as an occupation that is incompatible with all the other things they have to do: they "don't have the time." ²

God is looking for you not just on Sundays or in response to the latest headline, He's looking for you at the office and at the dinner table.

The Apostle Paul provided encouragement to early believers through his letters, personal visits, and teachings about the "weapons" of prayer.³ But the greatest call and example to prayer was Jesus Himself. Although His day was filled from morning to night with addressing crowds, healing the sick, traveling, and training His disciples -- He made prayer a top priority. "If Jesus was so dependent upon His fellowship in prayer alone with His Father, how much more you and we should spend time alone in prayer." ⁴

Maybe news of the day has left you questioning, or its been a long time since you've prayed and your prayers have lost their fervor. Today I invite you to take up the shield of your faith and the gifts of our Church, and be encouraged as we gather together and pray.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In the seventeenth century, English Catholics, many of them wealthy and well educated, looked to the American colonies as a place to regain a measure of religious freedom. In Ireland, the so-called penal laws were even harsher than in England, as a minority Parliament tried to force the conversion of the population by denying the majority political and economic power. Beginning in 1691, laws were passed that punished dissenters, principally Catholics, but also causing hardship for Jews, Quakers, and others. There were acts forbidding “mixed marriage” or sending children “beyond the seas” for schooling. Catholics were taxed at double the common rate, barred from the legal professions and from university, and not allowed to build churches or own a decent horse.

In 1793 the situation began to change, as it became clear that the economic persecution would not drive the majority away from Catholicism. Gradually, laws were repealed until by 1829 freedom was won, although Catholics at university were ineligible for honors, and until the 1920s when the Republic was formed, the Church of Ireland was the state church, funded by the taxes of all citizens.

There will be no 6:20 AM or 8:00 AM Mass.


The Veteran’s Day Mass is coordinated by our Knights of Columbus. All are welcome to attend—especially those family members and friends affiliated with the Armed Forces.

CONFIDENCE IN THE LORD

We are nearing the end of the liturgical year. Today’s readings remind us that our own lives will draw to a close one day, and we can be certain that the Lord will encourage, strengthen, and save us—both now and at the last. The astonishing story of the Maccabees invigorates our faith as we behold an entire family willing to die rather than deny the Law of Moses. The psalm response echoes the faithful cries of the Maccabees: “I call upon you, for you will answer me, O God.” That same confidence appears in Saint Paul’s letter to the Thessalonians. “The Lord is faithful,” he testifies; “he will strengthen you and guard you from the evil one.” In the Gospel, Jesus explains just how long God’s protection will endure. The children of God whom God guards, Jesus says, will live forever like angels.

EUCCHARISTIC MINISTER TRAINING

Are you being called by God to serve in His Church as a Eucharistic Minister of Holy Communion? This is an open invitation for you to come with an open heart for an evening of prayer, discerning God's call for you. A Eucharistic Minister distributes Holy Communion at the regularly scheduled weekday and/or weekend Masses. They may also assist in ministering to the homebound parishioners, those in hospitals and in nursing facilities.

The guidelines for this ministry:

- You must be a fully initiated Catholic. (Baptized, First Holy Communion, and Confirmed).
- You must be at least 18 years of age.

Those entering into this ministry should be persons who sincerely try to live the Gospel message in their communal and individual lives. They should faithfully participate in the Sunday Eucharist and with God's grace strive to live their faith in every aspect of their lives. 
While the Sacristy is completed the work continues on the Hall and Church Roofs.
