Presentation of Mary

This week, we will be celebrating the Feast of the Presentation of Mary on November 21st. Between now and Christmas there are three great Marian Feast days, November 21- The Presentation of Mary, December 8th – The Immaculate Conception, and December 12th – Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. I like to think of the entire period of Advent as days holy to Mary, as she prepares to become the Mother of God.

The Presentation of Mary to the Temple is not mentioned in the Canonical Gospels. However, other early writings, written in the time of the early church do mention this. These writings were never accepted as part of scripture and are considered Apocryphal. The early Eastern Church adopted this Feast day sometime in the 5th Century. It wasn't celebrated in the Western Church until about the 11th Century and wasn't officially adopted until the 16th Century.

You might ask yourself, since this event is not considered historical but rather a legend, why should we celebrate it? Mary is the most extraordinary human being known in our faith's history. Her role as the Mother of God is unparalleled. The Church wants to honor that extraordinary role she played by acknowledging that from her conception she was destined to belong to God. Being presented to the Temple was a tradition in the time of her birth. The story tells us she was presented to the Temple when she was three years old where she lived until she was twelve. From the youngest age, she was groomed to be a woman of great faith, devoted to service to God. Legend also suggests that her parents, Anne and Joachim, died when she was young and therefore she was a ward of the Temple. Mary, herself, becomes a Temple as her womb holds the Christ child.

In just a few short weeks, we will be celebrating the beginning of a new Church year, starting with the first Sunday of Advent. "To celebrate Advent means: to become Marian, to enter into that communion with Mary's 'Yes,' which, ever anew, is room for God's birth, for the 'fullness of time,'" said Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI.

St. Teresa of Calcutta famously said, "no Mary, no Jesus." What we need to ponder during the Advent season is Mary's "Yes". Advent is a time to be more fully inspired by Mary's beautiful fiat — "May it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:36). The good news for us is that the greatest gifts we can give are those that come with no price tag: the gift of faith by sharing the Gospel with others and the gift of love by seeing Christ in the faces of those we encounter.

So, starting with the November 21st celebration of the Presentation of Mary to the Temple, let us prepare ourselves to receive the message of Mary, her "Yes" to the Lord, so we can carry that forward in our own lives.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We are faced with strong and disturbing readings today that hold a certain fascination, since they seem at first glance to be blueprints for future inevitable wars and hardship. A fundamentalist interpretation focuses on this aspect. Yet we hear them at our Sunday celebration of the Eucharist, which infuses them with hope and optimism. Rather than dreading the future, today’s liturgy assures us that God is with us in all of life’s inevitable trials, and that we have a role in shaping the outcome of human history. Occasionally, some Christians have attempted to decode these readings for an exact measure of the world’s end, but they have thus far been disappointed.

“Nothing lasts forever” is a lyric from a Broadway show. Stars fall from the sky, leaves wither and fall, mountains wash into the sea, human projects and governments totter and collapse with great regularity. Today’s liturgy opposes this idea as incomplete, reminding us that Christ has made a permanent change in human history, and that life in him is life forever. Rather than inviting us to throw in the towel, today’s liturgy strengthens us for acts of goodness and grace in our families, communities, and world.

LIFE IS HARD, BUT HAVE NO FEAR

Today’s readings take a fearless look at reality and reach a conclusion that we all know: life is hard. The prophet Malachi preaches fire and brimstone, warning us that evildoers will perish in flames. Saint Paul offers his own warning to the Thessalonians: keep busy, but never become a busybody. He reminds Christians that the apostles themselves worked in “toil and drudgery” as a model for how we ought to contribute to our community. The Gospel returns to the apocalyptic tone of Malachi, describing the utter chaos of the end-times. We will know the end is near when violence, catastrophe, and hatred dominate the earth. But we must not fear! God’s saving plan brings peace to our hearts. Malachi speaks of the sun’s “healing rays,” and Jesus himself promises to protect every hair on our heads.



COACHES NEEDED


Please consider stepping forward to volunteer at St. Louise School as a coach for the following sports:
