

Respect Life from Womb to Tomb

A responsibility of every Catholic is to try and understand the Church's positions on ethical topics. Making ethical decisions around scientific and medical issues are the most difficult.

Human beings, by nature, are curious. This curiosity has brought forth great things; from the discovery that we could control fire to sending spaceships to the moon, to outer space, and someday to Mars. We discovered how to split the atom. In our rush to control our environment and the resources of the earth, global warming has occurred. The good news is we can learn. There has been a concerted effort to make sure that nuclear weapons are never used again. We have the ability to undo the harm caused by global warming. We can use scientific research to replace technologies that add carbon to the air. We can clean up the plastic from the oceans. We can clean our water and resolve to not continue polluting.

Medical ethical decisions are even more thorny. One facing us today is how we use stem cell research. The Catholic Church's position on embryonic stem cell research is clear. "No objective, even though noble in itself, such as a foreseeable advantage to science, to other human beings or to society, can in any way justify experimentation on living human embryos or fetuses, whether viable or not, either inside or outside the mother's womb" (Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith, 1987).

From the moment of conception, those two cells are a human life. In embryonic stem cell research, they use embryos 5-6 days old. For us, that 5 to 6 day old embryo is the same as the 9 month old fetus: human life. Stem cells "have the remarkable potential to develop into many different cell types in the body during early life and growth." (National Institute of Health, Stem Cell Basics, 2015) The reason this is such a difficult issue is embryonic cells have the potential to cure a whole host of diseases, such as Parkinson's, ALS, spinal cord injuries, Alzheimer's, burns, heart disease, diabetes, arthritis and many more. Proponents of embryonic stem cell research believe the benefit outweighs the moral implications of destroying life. The Catholic faith disagrees.



We are not opposed to all stem cell research. Most types of stem cell research (especially adult stem cell research) are encouraged. Stem cells can be derived from these morally acceptable sources: Umbilical Cord Stem Cells, Placenta-derived Stem Cells, and Adult Stem cells. In the case of miscarriages, the use of the embryonic cells would be acceptable as long as the miscarriage was not self-induced. In all cases, the Church is opposed to any creation of actual embryos using stem cells.

Understanding our position on life issues is fairly easy. From conception to natural death, we hold life sacred. However, some of the consequences from our position is not so easy. We have watched loved ones suffer from terrible diseases. Knowing we are hindering research on curing those diseases is hard. We need to pray that as scientists continue to research stem cells from acceptable sources, they make progress rapidly.

LATEST REVISIONS TO OUR PARISH SCHEDULE

By now most parishioners are aware that Governor Newsom has ordered the closure of many indoor activities and events due to rising cases of COVID 19. This latest directive includes places of worship. Fortunately the order does allow for continued outdoor services. While we appreciate the frustration these orders cause everyone, please remember that they are designed to keep everyone as safe as possible and to minimize further spread of the virus. We are grateful that our parishioners are supportive of these goals.

Our team at St. Louise de Marillac has worked hard to make modifications that will enable us to continue with outdoor services this weekend. Essentially the revised plan asks parishioners to enter the parking lot, remain in their vehicles and watch or listen to Mass from their car. Communion will be brought to you at the appropriate time.


Please familiarize yourself with the following information before arriving for Mass:

- The Church is closed until further notice.
- All Masses will continue to be livestreamed and you may watch live on Facebook.
- When vehicles arrive, they will receive a sheet that includes information and instructions.
- We are required to request basic information (name, phone number, email) that will allow us to notify parishioners should the parish learn of a possible exposure to COVID 19 during any event.
- This information will be collected as parishioners exit the parking lot after Mass.
- All vehicles will enter the parking lot from the east Covina Boulevard driveway and will exit onto Bonnie Cove Avenue.
- Given the heat of summer and the limited resources of staff and volunteers, the Mass schedule has been modified as follows:
 - Saturday Evening – 6:30 pm. **PLEASE NOTE THE TIME CHANGE.**
 - Sunday Morning – 6:30 am, 8:00 am, 9:30 am, and 11:00 am
 - There will be **no** 12:30 pm or 5:00 pm Mass until further notice.
 - You will not need a reservation to attend Mass.
- Listen to Mass on your radio by tuning to 99.3 FM. This will only work if you are on the parish campus.
- When on campus, you may also watch Mass on your personal device by finding “SLDM-MASS” from the available Wi-Fi connections. No password is required.
- Follow the directions and guidance of staff and volunteers when parking your vehicle.
- Please use parking spaces closest to the Church and park facing the Church. Do not park in a new row until the previous row is full.
- Parking cones will provide separation between parking spaces to ensure social distancing.
- Restrooms are available in Msgr. Pierce Hall. Please wear a mask and practice social distancing if you use the restroom.
- Eucharistic Ministers will bring communion to each car. Please remain in your car and wait for the arrival of the Eucharistic Ministers. Please have your mask on before their arrival.
- Once they have arrived, please roll down your window, extend your hands outside of the lowered window, and carefully receive communion. Remove your mask, consume the Precious Body, place your mask back on, and roll your window up.
- During offertory, staff and volunteers will provide an opportunity for you to support the mission and work of our parish community. Please feel free to place your gift in the basket as it comes by.
- You may also contribute by visiting stlouisedm.org/give/ This choice is preferred, as it enables you to regularly support the parish mission, minimizes physical contact, and reduces staff workload.
- The 8:00 am weekday Mass will continue and will follow the same format as the Sunday Masses.
- Confessions will continue on Wednesdays from 3 PM to 5 PM and Saturdays from 3 PM and 4:30 PM.
- Eventbrite reservations are encouraged for confessions. You may also join the standby line, but will be asked to provide basic information in case we need to notify you of a possible exposure.
- Please check in with a staff member under the canopy by the Faith Formation Office. Our two priests will be in each breezeway outside the Classrooms.
- A staff member will direct you to an available priest.
- Social distancing will be practiced between priest and penitent and between those waiting to have their confession heard.
- Masks must be worn at all times.
- If you have not yet done so, please call the parish office to sign up for our phone blasts or text ‘sldm’ to 84576 to keep updated.

Thank you for your cooperation and willingness to follow these guidelines. Let’s all pray for the safety of each other and that those who are working so hard to keep us safe will in turn be safe themselves. We pray in a special way for those who are afflicted with the virus. May Our Heavenly Lord watch over and care for each of them!

There will be a basket out for donations.

Our drive-in theatre is open every Friday through July 31st. If you attend the drive-in, be advised that:

- You must wear a mask when visiting the restrooms and concessions.
- You must not leave your vehicle except to visit the bathroom or concession trucks.
- You must view the movie from within your vehicle.
- Except when interacting with employees and volunteers of St. Louise de Marillac, persons inside vehicles, even with windows down, are not required to wear face coverings.
- The setting up of lawn chairs, portable chairs, blankets, or seats outside of a vehicle is strictly prohibited during and for film screenings.
- Persons from the same vehicle may sit in the back bed of a truck or the rear cargo area of a van, SUV, or other similar vehicles for viewing screened films; provided, however, that no person shall exit such areas without wearing a face covering.
- You must practice social distancing at all times.
- If you do not follow the above guidelines, you will be asked to leave.
- Parking will be designed to allow social distancing. Follow directions from employees and volunteers.

St. Louise Gives Back

This past week Father Robert met with Xochitl Hernandez, the Regional Director of the San Gabriel Regional of the Catholic Charities of Los Angeles to present a grant for \$10,000.00. This grant will provide resources for programs in the San Gabriel Region that serve the most vulnerable among us.

Catholic Charities of Los Angeles just celebrated 100 years of helping the poor in Los Angeles, Ventura, and Santa Barbara counties. They are the social service arm of the Los Angeles Archdiocese. The agency has helped supply emergency services and the basic necessities of life to the most impoverished residents of the Archdiocese. It also strives to find permanent solutions to crisis situations by offering clients the tools and resources they need to achieve greater self-reliance and stability in their lives.

Programs in the San Gabriel Region include three Community Services Centers that serve low-income families and individuals with food and clothing distribution, emergency utility and transportation services, and emergency shelter assistance. They also run McGill Street House, which our parish has assisted in the past with our Christmas Ornament Project. The McGill House helps homeless families and provides refuge from domestic violence.

On behalf of all of our parishioners, St. Louise de Marillac is proud to provide this grant to our community partner that serves the poor right here in our own neighborhood.

NATURAL FAMILY PLANNING AWARENESS WEEK

Natural Family Planning Awareness Week is July 19–25, 2020. It annually highlights the anniversary of *Humanae vitae* on July 25 as well as the feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, the parents of the Blessed Mother, which is on July 26. This year's theme is "Live the truth and beauty of God's plan for married love!"

Natural Family Planning (NFP) methods represent authentic family planning. They can be used to both achieve and to postpone a pregnancy. NFP makes use of periodic abstinence from sexual intercourse based upon the observation of the woman's natural signs of fertility, in order to space births or to limit the number of children when there is a serious reason to do so... this practice fosters in couples an attitude of respect and wonder in the face of human life, which is sacred. It also fosters profound respect for one's spouse, which is necessary for... authentic intimacy. (Marriage: Love and Life in the Divine Plan, U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, 2009, p. 20)

NFP is an umbrella term for certain methods used to achieve and avoid pregnancies. These methods are based on observation of the naturally occurring signs and symptoms of the fertile and infertile phases of a woman's menstrual cycle. Couples using NFP to avoid pregnancy abstain from intercourse and genital contact during the fertile phase of the woman's cycle. No drugs, devices, or surgical procedures are used to avoid pregnancy. NFP reflects the dignity of the human person within the context of marriage and family life, promotes openness to life, and recognizes the value of the child. By respecting the love-giving and life-giving natures of marriage, NFP can enrich the bond between husband and wife. (Standards for Diocesan Natural Family Planning Ministry, U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, 2010, p. 23)




SAINT SHARBEL MAKHLŪF (1828-1898)

The convenience store owner chatted animatedly in Arabic with coworkers, but hardly at all with his American clientele. So soon after 9/11, he probably figured, with my accent, the less said, the better. That changed when an American customer recognized Saint Sharbel's portrait on the wall: "So you're Lebanese Maronites!" The owner was happily incredulous: "You know our saint?" "Not at first," the customer admitted. "But we help the Catholic Near East Welfare Association, and their magazine published that picture and called Sharbel the 'Paradoxical Artisan of Peace.'" "Everyone thinks we're Muslims," said the owner, "and some of my workers are. Saint Sharbel helps us live together in peace!" A hermit for twenty-three years, little is known of Sharbel's life. He died after suffering a stroke while celebrating the liturgy. Miracles attributed to his intercession number in the thousands, and in war-torn Lebanon, Catholics, Orthodox, and Muslims pray together where his incorrupt body is entombed. How lovely if after our passing, we too could be remembered for having brought very different people to the one God, together in peace.




