

What am I supposed to do now?

As the pandemic drags on, it is taking a toll on all of us. For some of us, the economic impact is serious. For others, social isolation is leading to depression. For all of us, worry makes us anxious. We have no control over this. We have no past experiences to lean upon. We are having to live day by day without knowing what the future holds.

As you can imagine, depression and anxiety are hitting new highs among Americans. It makes sense that facing a new, scary, and unknown situation will bring about anxiety. Living with that fear for months on end can cause serious depression.

Knowing some symptoms of depression might help in a “self-check” to determine how you are doing. You may feel irritable, exhausted, anxious, hyper-vigilant, and angry. Couple that with other behavior changes likely occurring during COVID-19 stay-at-home orders, like irregular eating and sleeping patterns and shifting energy use, and it’s a recipe for a mental health disaster. This can create anxiety, ongoing stress, depression, and thoughts of suicide. It is important that you seek help if you feel these symptoms are becoming more severe or if you have thoughts of suicide. Call the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at 1-800-273-8255 if you are feeling suicidal. Call your primary care physician if you think you need help. As Catholics, we look to scripture for help whenever we are facing a difficult situation.



Consider the story of Moses. He was tasked with leading the Israelites through the desert. It's hot. People are hungry, and their expectations of him are very high. Moses feels overwhelmed. He lashes out at God, saying, “Why have you treated me so badly? What am I supposed to do now? If this is the way you’re going to treat me, put me to death at once and do not let me see my misery” (Num. 11:10–17).


God tells Moses, “Gather 70 elders. I will take some of the spirit that is on you and put it on them; and they shall bear the burden of the people along with you so that you will not bear it by yourself.” God recognized Moses’ fragile state and sent others to check in and be present to him.

Look at the psalms. The psalmists’ express despair (Ps. 22), suffering (Ps. 38), and loneliness (Ps. 88). They lament to God (Ps. 13) and ask for help (Ps. 6). These feelings that society tends to label as “bad” are honored in the Bible. So are the reactions that follow, “Jesus wept” (John 11:35): the shortest and perhaps most profound line in all of scripture. The Son of God let his feelings out. We should do the same.

From these examples, we see that we need others to help us (Moses.) We can express our anger, fears and despair (Psalms.) And, we need to get our emotions out (John 11:35.) With God and each other, we will get through this together.

SUMMER DRIVE-IN MOVIES

“...Lights!...Camera!...ACTION! We welcome everyone to enjoy films on the parish parking lot every Friday in July starting July 10th – July 31st. These evenings are FREE to attend. Parking begins at 7:00 PM. There is limited parking, so it is first come first served. Movies begin at 8:30. Tune into 99.3 FM in order to listen to the movie through your radio!

Our drive-in theatre is open every Friday through July 31st. If you attend the drive-in, be advised that:

- You must wear a mask when visiting the restrooms and concessions.
- You must not leave your vehicle except to visit the bathroom or concession trucks.
- You must view the movie from within your vehicle.
- Except when interacting with employees and volunteers of St. Louise de Marillac, persons inside vehicles, even with windows down, are not required to wear face coverings.
- The setting up of lawn chairs, portable chairs, blankets, or seats outside of a vehicle is strictly prohibited during and for film screenings.
- Persons from the same vehicle may sit in the back bed of a truck or the rear cargo area of a van, SUV, or other similar vehicles for viewing screened films; provided, however, that no person shall exit such areas without wearing a face covering.
- You must practice social distancing at all times.
- If you do not follow the above guidelines, you will be asked to leave.
- Parking will be designed to allow social distancing. Follow directions from employees and volunteers.



SAINT BENEDICT, ABBOT

July 11

What's known about the father of Western monasticism is from the "Dialogues of (Pope) St. Gregory the Great." Sent to Rome to study, 20-year-old Benedict shunned the city's wickedness to take up solitary living in Subiaco. He stayed there for about 25 years, with disciples he organized into 12 small communities. Around 529 he established the monastery at Monte Cassino, near Naples, where he spent the rest of his life and finalized his famous Rule, which spread throughout Western Europe. St. Scholastica was his sister; St. Gregory describes their spiritual talks and moving final meeting. Benedict is the patron saint of Europe and of spelunkers, perhaps because some of his early foundations were in caves or grottoes.

SAINT MARIA GORETTI (1890-1902)

July 6

Does anything match a mother's pride in her children? First Communions, confirmations, graduations, weddings: how these delight a mother's heart! Imagine, then, Assunta Goretti, the only mother ever to attend her child's canonization! In poverty-stricken rural Italy, widowed Assunta tended fields for the Serenelli family, whose eighteen-year-old son, Alessandro, propositioned her barely twelve-year-old Maria; then, when she resisted, crying, "It is a sin! God forbids it!" he stabbed her fourteen times. As she lay dying, Maria assured the attending priest, "Yes, I forgive Alessandro! I want him to be in Paradise with me someday." Imprisoned, unrepentant, Alessandro changed after dreaming that a radiant Maria had offered him fourteen lilies. "I've kept my promise," she smiled. "You'll be here with me someday." Upon release, he rushed to beg Assunta's forgiveness. "Jesus has forgiven you," she replied, "my Maria, too. How can I refuse?" Next morning, mother and murderer walked arm in arm to church and knelt side by side for Communion.

LA COUNTY FREE LUNCH PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN

Children and youth ages 18 and under receive a "grab and go" nutritious lunch and snack that include vegetables, fruits, seeds and healthy dairy products like milk, string cheese and yogurt, at participating Los Angeles County Libraries and Parks, including the Charter Oak Park.

They can pick up a lunch at the participating LA County Libraries beginning now until August 7th on Tuesday through Friday from 12 PM to 1 PM. They can also pick up a lunch at LA County Parks until August 7th on Tuesday through Friday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM. Neither will be available on Friday, July 3rd.

Due to health and safety restrictions to prevent the spread of COVID-19, lunch and snack will be available for pick up only. Face coverings and physical distancing of six feet are required. For convenience, lunch and snack can be picked up simultaneously.

Lunch is available for no-contact pickup on a first come, first served basis, while supplies last. There are no restrictions on family income.

Created to help reduce the growing percentage of young people in the United States challenged by obesity or lack of consistent access to wholesome meals, the program aims to provide a healthy alternative for students when school is out for the summer. In order for participating parks to qualify for the program, they must service areas within the geographical boundaries of elementary, middle, or high school attendance areas with at least 50% of its students eligible for free or reduced-price school meals.

Since 2015, LA County Library has been offering free, nutritious lunches to kids 18 and under with its Lunch at the Library program. It keeps children and teens nourished during the summer months, helping to ensure that kids return to school in the fall ready to learn.

Lunch at the Library is a partnership between LA County Library and the Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation, and is supported by the California Summer Meal Coalition and California Library Association. This program is supported by a grant from the California State Library.
