

Bible at Core of Catholic Beliefs

People ask if everything Catholics believe is found in the Bible. The answer? Both “yes” and “no.” The Church “does not derive her certainty about all revealed truths from the Holy Scriptures alone” (Catechism of the Catholic Church [CCC] no. 82 Dei Verbum 9). Jesus is the ultimate Source of everything Catholics believe, for he reveals God’s plan to save the world from sin as he reveals the Father’s love. Jesus does this because he is the Son of God. He is always united with his Father and thus is the fullness of both Revelation.

The mission of Jesus continues through the ministry of the Church that he founded, and he has given the Church the inspiration of the Holy Spirit for guidance in everything. The Revelation of Jesus is thus extended to the Apostles and handed on through two means: Sacred Scripture and Tradition.

Sacred Scripture is the inspired word of God, the collection of sacred books that hand on the truth of Revelation in written form.

Tradition, as understood by the Church, is more than a collection of customs or time-honored habits. It encompasses the Church’s teaching, life and worship. The living apostolic Tradition highlights the fact that the Apostles received the words and deeds of Jesus who passed on the authority to teach in his name. “Tradition transmits, in its entirety, the Word of God which has been entrusted to the apostles by Christ the Lord and the Holy Spirit” (CCC no 81; Dei Verbum 9).

The Bible reveals that God fulfilled his saving plan of love to free us from sin. The culmination of the entire Bible are the words and deeds of Jesus, in particular his Passion, death and glorious Resurrection.

The beliefs of Catholics are found in the Bible in two ways: explicit and implicit. Some teachings of the Catholic Church are easily found in the Bible. For example, that Jesus is the Son of God, that he called Twelve Apostles to follow him, that he healed, forgave sins, proclaimed the Kingdom of God present in his person, and that he suffered, died and rose again for our sins, are all very explicit in the Bible. The Holy Spirit makes known the full meaning of these events in and through the Church, and makes the power of these events effective throughout history and in our lives today.

Some beliefs are more hidden. Love loves to hide secrets, so that when we find them we are enraptured even more by their beauty. The mystery of Jesus is so profound that sometimes you have to look closely to see all the parts that he has made known. The Holy Spirit has hidden some dimensions of the mission of Jesus in the Bible. The truths of faith are clarified by the Tradition through the Magisterium, the Church’s authentic teaching office. These truths never contradict the Word of God in Scripture, but serve to articulate its truth more clearly.

The Holy Spirit helps us to find and to articulate these mysteries. The teaching on the Trinity, that is, that there are three Persons in one God, is found in the Bible in the many instances where Jesus speaks about his relationship with the Father and the Holy Spirit. The terms that the Church needed to express this mystery were given to her over several hundred years by the same Holy Spirit that inspired the Gospel writers as they wrote of the words of Jesus that revealed the mystery in the first place. The Church’s teachings about the Blessed Mother, the saints, the role of virtue and holiness are found in the Bible implicitly in varying degrees.”

THIS WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

St. Vincent de Paul

During this time, St. Louise's St. Vincent de Paul Society is active. It just looks a little different than usual to adapt to the current needs of our community.

They have been serving some of their regular clients by providing non-perishable food by appointments on a monthly basis. They also make many referrals to Shepherd's Pantry to quarantined families due to COVID-19 for home delivery of food .

They provide fried chicken on a monthly basis to Hope For Home shelter in Pomona and have provided eight cases of diapers for needy families at Shepherd's pantry. Our St. Vincent de Paul also provided 40 pounds of ground beef to our partners at Saint Madeleine Saint Vincent de Paul food distribution. Saint Madeleine SVDP distributes food to needy families every Sunday between 9:30 AM and 11:30 AM. We will continue to partner with them.

DEFINITIONS

What are extern priests?

These are priests who were ordained for one diocese, but are serving in another for a period of time. The diocese where they were ordained provides them with formation and oversight.

What is incardinated?

Priests and deacons in the Catholic Church, referred to as clerics, must be attached to a particular Church or religious institute to which they must be accountable and which must be accountable to them. Every cleric in the Church makes a promise or vow of obedience to a bishop, prelate or religious superior who directs his ministry and ensures that he is engaged in the work of the Gospel in accord with his talents, aptitudes and abilities.

The relationship of obedience and accountability between a cleric and his diocese or religious order is referred to as incardination. The word literally means "to be hinged" because a cleric is attached as if by a hinge.

Typically, incardination is a life-long relationship. However, there may be times when a cleric transfers his incardination from one diocese to another, or from a religious institute to a diocese, or vice versa. This may be because he moves to a new ministry in a new place, and intends to remain in that place for the rest of his life, or because he feels called to religious life, etc. Transfer of incardination is usually an indication that the Holy Spirit is moving in a cleric's life in a new way.

TRUST


Keys hold great significance for those who carry them. They represent the trust and authority of the owner when given to another person. We may give our house key to a trusted friend to take care of our matters while we are away. We may give keys to someone responsible for maintaining or working in a particular building. Keys to vehicles are given to people who have proven themselves responsible drivers. The readings today focus on this kind of trust—the trust that conveys authority and responsibility. In the first reading, the symbol is specifically that of a key; but the second reading and the Gospel also speak of trust and leadership as they refer to the earthly church that Jesus established.

ONLINE MINISTRY FORMATION CENTER

The San Gabriel Pastoral Region online Ministry Formation Center will start in October. Due to the current COVID-19 situation and the uncertainty of on-site meetings, we have planned the 2020-2021 ministry formation centers in an online platform. A Ministry Formation Center (MFC) is offered as the basic theological and ministry foundation Phase for Catechist and ministerial

Certification, and is highly recommended for all catechetical leaders and ministry teams including RCIA, Liturgy, Evangelization, Adult Faith Formation teams and more. Any adult interested in learning more about their faith is welcome to participate.



Each ministry formation center currently consists of three modules, each module is structured with four to six sessions. Each Zoom Live Session corresponds to the topics covered in a typical half day formation experience. Online sessions run for one week each and are asynchronous, meaning you can complete the work at any time during the week according to the schedule you set for yourself. At the beginning of the formation center a Zoom Live orientation will be offered. Each module will have one Zoom Live session. It will cost \$50 for all three modules.

SAINT JOSEPH CALASANZ (1556-1648)

August 25

This Spaniard studied law at the University of Lerida and was ordained a priest in 1583 despite his father's hope that he would be a soldier. He became vicar general of a Spanish diocese, but in 1592 left for Rome, where he joined the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine and worked with neglected children. In 1597 he established the first free school in Rome with three other priests. This work led him to found the Clerks Regular of the Religious (or Pius) Schools, known as Piarists. He overcame internal and external opposition and served as superior general of the order. He was canonized in 1767, and in 1948 Pope Pius XII named him the patron saint of Christian schools. He is also a patron of students.





SAINT MONICA (332-387)

August 27

She had smiles for the neighbors, though her husband found her religion and the charity it inspired annoying. She made tearful prayers in private for a son, outwardly self-assured but, as his mother knew, inwardly restless, and whose girlfriend of a dozen years had borne his child out of wedlock. Though not the first or last such mother and son, Monica and Augustine are the Church's most famous, so we keep their feast days back to back, with Monica's, fittingly, first. To Rome she followed Augustine, then to Milan, where years of prayer—and nagging—finally bore fruit in his conversion by Saint Ambrose. For six months, mother and son enjoyed the blessing of rediscovering each other. Just in time! On the way home to North Africa, Monica took sick and died near Rome. No child who has mourned a parent can read, unmoved, Augustine's tender account, in his Confessions, of Monica's last days. At this time of the year, when parents watch apprehensively as children leave for school, may Monica's perseverance and Augustine's long-prayed-for conversion ease anxiety and kindle hope.

Your child's teachers will likely have detailed plans for how to handle any online schooling. Talk to them about what apps or websites your child will need, and their plans for protecting children from cyber bullying, inappropriate contact, and other online dangers.
