

Aging and End of Life During a Pandemic

Philosophers say each of us dies alone, leaving life the same way we came into the world, alone. I reject this. First, we are never alone from the first moment of conception to taking our last breath as long as God cares; God is with us. Second, we are social beings! People instinctively turn towards one another. We share sorrow and joy. We need one another. And finally, when we think of a good death, we think of a person surrounded by the people who love the one dying. Yet, the horrible nature of the pandemic is that it has made these mortal gatherings unsafe.

This may be the saddest part of how we must live today, while we wait for the time when we can once again socialize freely and safely. The sickest of us go to hospitals and our families and friends can't offer us their physical support. This is hard for both the sick and the family. The sick person feels isolated and the family is frantic with worry without being able to get information or being reassured by seeing their loved one. When your loved one dies in a hospital, and you did not get an opportunity to say goodbye, this complicates the grieving process.

Nurses say that families should be comforted to know that those patients in their care are not dying alone; nurses are still providing physical comfort and helping dying patients to communicate with remote family members whenever possible. Comfort may be buffered by a face mask and gloves, but whenever possible, care workers are comforting the dying wherever they are—in ICUs or a nursing home.



Rituals around dying have been interrupted. For Catholics, postponing the funeral rites is devastating. From the vigil, through the liturgy to the committal, grieving Catholics get an opportunity to begin to process the loss they have experienced. I don't believe any of us ever thought this would not be available to us. Today, we can have the funeral liturgies outdoors, but must practice safety measures to keep everyone safe. Everyone must wear masks, use hand sanitizer and there must be social distancing. This has been a relief since the early days of the lock-down. Still, many of us miss gathering in a large group in the Church where we can offer each other physical support.

Our seniors have an additional burden. People over the age of 65 make up the largest number of people who die when they contract the virus. In cases of all persons contracting Covid 19 in the US, the death rate is 3%. In people over the age of 65, the death rate is 11.5%. Because of this, seniors have had to take extra precautions to not risk getting the virus. Many of these precautions leave them isolated from their families and leave them feeling like they are trapped in their homes.

Archbishop Gomez said the following, "With the worldwide outbreak of the coronavirus, we are confronted once more with the fragility of our lives, and again we are reminded of our common humanity — that the peoples of this world are our brothers and sisters, that we are all one family under God. God does not abandon us; he goes with us even now in this time of trial and testing... Let us draw closer to one another in our love for him and rediscover the things that truly matter in our lives."

As brothers and sisters to each other, let us make sure we are doing our part to keep others safe by following CDC guidelines and by doing what we can to alleviate the suffering of people around us, especially those hardest hit by this pandemic.





Today, Sunday, September 27th, marks the 13th anniversary of Msgr. Robert T. Pierce's death, a former St. Louise pastor.


We owe much to Msgr. Pierce for all he did to make our parish, in his words, "second to none".

40 DAYS OF LIFE

It is hard to believe, but there are 10 abortion clinics within 15 miles of Glendora. Every month, over 1,000 lives are lost from abortion in the San Gabriel Valley alone. This is a great tragedy, but we recognize that with God, anything is possible, even the end of abortion. 40 Days for Life will be hosting a prayer vigil where volunteers will take turns praying in front of the Glendora Planned Parenthood on Route 66—24 hours a day for 40 days. 

ONLINE MINISTRY FORMATION CENTER

The San Gabriel Pastoral Region online Ministry Formation Center will start in October. Due to the current COVID-19 situation and the uncertainty of on-site meetings, we have planned the 2020-2021 ministry formation centers in an online platform. A Ministry Formation Center (MFC) is offered as the basic theological and ministry foundation Phase for Catechist and ministerial

Certification, and is highly recommended for all catechetical leaders and ministry teams including RCIA, Liturgy, Evangelization, Adult Faith Formation teams and more. Any adult interested in learning more about their faith is welcome to participate.



Each ministry formation center currently consists of three modules, each module is structured with four to six sessions. SAINT THERESE OF THE CHILD JESUS (1873-1897)

October 1st

"The cornerstone's dated 1872, but the stained glass is much later," explained the pastor, astonished when his visitor accurately dated it to just before the Great Depression, explaining, "The window for the Little Flower"—Thérèse's nickname—"gives it away." From her canonization in 1925, her statues and windows adorn most churches where European immigrants worshiped. Entering Carmel at fifteen, victim of tuberculosis at twenty-four, Thérèse proposed her "Little Way" to sanctity: doing ordinary tasks with extraordinary love. Thus ordinary Catholics, many of whom had lost loved ones to tuberculosis, embraced her. Though she never left her cloister, this Carmelite's spiritual communion and devoted correspondence with missionaries earned her the title Patroness of Missions. Her autobiography, *Story of a Soul*, continuously in print since her death, chronicles her prayerful perseverance through doubt and caused her to be the youngest person ever named a Doctor of the Church. Countless physical healings and spiritual conversions testify to her fulfillment of her deathbed promise: "After my death, I will let fall a shower of roses. I will spend my heaven doing good upon earth!"

DID YOU KNOW?

Words can be warning signs of abuse

Many children will be learning in their own homes this fall, but that does not mean they will be fully protected from abuse. Sadly, most children are abused by someone considered to be a "known and trusted" person – that person may be a family member – even someone living in the same house as the child. Pay attention to the conversations your children are having, as words can be indicators that a child is being groomed or harmed. If your child or their friend(s) seem to "know" more about sexual topics than would be expected for their age, or seems unusually focused on such topics, it could be an indicator that something inappropriate and harmful is happening.
