## Gratitude and Thanksgiving

When the weather turns cold, I always begin thinking about the upcoming holiday season. Even the act of pulling out sweaters brings a smile to my lips. I feel hope.

This Thanksgiving and this Christmas will be celebrated differently than most of us have celebrated these holidays before 2020. We have to work hard to not let this dash our holiday spirit. For many of us, Thanksgiving is the time we would gather as many family members and friends as we can to help us celebrate. Leaves are put on tables. Card tables are hauled out of closets and garages to make a few more seats. The family cooks go crazy trying to make sure all dishes being served are ready at the same moment. We sit shoulder to shoulder at the table as the turkey is carved, the dressing and potatoes are passed around the table. There are pies to cut and serve at the end of the meal. These are the Thanksgivings past that we are nostalgic for. Some families have a tradition of going around the table asking each person to mention one thing they are grateful for.

So, this year we will be doing it differently. Not as many family members will be able to gather. Even those who do will wear masks and sit distanced from each other. I bet some of you are planning virtual celebrations, with different households zooming or skyping in to toast each other and break bread in their respective homes. It will be different, but we can still connect with each other.

I do suggest that one tradition you do not lose is to be grateful. Melody Beattie, a self-help author, says, "Gratitude unlocks the fullness of life. It turns what we have into enough, and more. It turns denial into acceptance, chaos to order, confusion to clarity. It can turn a meal into a feast, a house into a home, a stranger to a friend." Gratitude is about noticing, appreciating and expressing thanks for what one has.

We have been dealing with a lot of anxiety these past 8 months. Between a global pandemic and a contentious election season, the best of us has experienced anxiety. Gratitude is an anxiety buster.

Gratitude affirms goodness; that there has been goodness in our life. Life isn't perfect, but we can see goodness. The second part of gratitude is seeing where that goodness comes from. We've had help. Sometimes that help has been from family members or friends who have been there for us. But, if we look deeply, we can see the hand of God. We have received many gifts, big and small, to help us achieve the goodness in our lives. Never forget that God is always with us and God has our backs! Remember, too, that the other part of Thanksgiving is to give thanks. Remember to add that prayer of Thanksgiving to God who created each of us.

Finally, we do have to spend a moment on prayers for those who are not as fortunate as we are. There are families who have lost loved ones to the COVID virus or other diseases this past year. There are people who are alone. Thanksgiving is a tough day for people who have no family or friends to be with. There are people who are homeless and people who struggle with poverty. Let us make sure we remember all those who are in need in our Thanksgiving prayers.

My sincere wish is that we all find joy and blessings this Thanksgiving.

**CHRISTMAS CARD COLLECTION**

As we have done for the past several years, St. Louise de Marillac has the opportunity to make the Christmas holiday better for our incarcerated brothers at the California Institute for Men in Chino (CIM). And this year we are expanding our efforts. We will also be providing cards for the young people at the McKinley Children’s Center in San Dimas.

2020 has been a particularly difficult year for the men at CIM and for the young people at the McKinley Center. Religious services and visiting were suspended at CIM in March and have yet to resume. They have been limited at McKinley, and foster children also feel more isolated and separated at this time of year. So the simple act of providing Christmas Cards and postage will make it possible for these men to stay connected with their families and loved ones during a difficult time of this particularly difficult year. And the Christmas Cards will allow the children at McKinley to stay connected with siblings and friends who they might otherwise have no contact with.

Because of the security requirements of these facilities, we’re asking that all of us donate new, unopened boxes of Christmas Cards and separate stamps. We ask that the donated cards for CIM and McKinley have religious themes. Donations will be accepted from November 28th to December 13th. A Collection box for the cards will be in the Parish Center for your convenience. The separate postage stamps should also be brought to the Parish Center and given to the office staff. Our Deacons will coordinate their delivery to CIM and McKinley.

Join us for some Christmas spirit as the School & Faith Formation Offices host a viewing of Disney's "A Christmas Carol" movie in the parish parking lot on **Friday, Dec. 4th.**

The evening is FREE to attend. Parking begins at 6:00 PM. A concession stand will be offered by the school's 8th Grade class including Little Caesar pizza for \$8 per pizza (by pre-order ONLY—cheese or pepperoni). School families can order online through their SMART Tuition account. Parishioners can order online through the parish's FaithDirect account. Concession stand proceeds will offset 8th Gr. graduation costs. There is limited parking, so it is first come first served. The movie will begin at 6:30. Tune into 99.3 FM in order to listen to the movie through your radio!

If you attend the drive-in, be advised that:

- You must wear a mask when visiting the restrooms and concession stand.
- You must not leave your vehicle except to visit the bathroom or concession stand.
- You must view the movie from within your vehicle.
- Except when interacting with employees and volunteers of St. Louise de Marillac, persons inside vehicles, even with windows down, are not required to wear face coverings.
- The setting up of lawn chairs, portable chairs, blankets, or seats outside of a vehicle is strictly prohibited during and for film screenings.
- Persons from the same vehicle may sit in the back bed of a truck or the rear cargo area of a van, SUV, or other similar vehicles for viewing screened films; provided, however, that no person shall exit such areas without wearing a face covering.
- You must practice social distancing at all times.
- If you do not follow the above guidelines, you will be asked to leave.
- Parking will be designed to allow social distancing. Follow directions from employees and volunteers.

## BLESSED MIGUEL AGUSTIN PRO (1981-1927)

November 27th

Graham Greene's classic *The Power and the Glory* immortalized Mexico's persecuted Church of the 1920s. But photographs of Father Pro—arms outstretched to image Christ Crucified, kneeling in prayer before the firing squad, crumpled dead on the ground—vividly, visually remind us that not long ago, not far away, the faith we take for granted cost everything! Born to a mining family, Miguel became a Jesuit and was sent to study Catholic labor movements in Belgium in preparation for evangelizing Mexico's workers. But he returned to find a Mexico determined to annihilate Catholicism, and, like priests before him during Roman persecutions, England's Reformation, and in China today, ministered secretly to an "underground Church" until apprehended and sentenced to the firing squad. In his final moments, Father Pro blessed his executioners, forgave his enemies, and shouted: "Viva el Cristo Rey!—Long Live Christ the King!"—his defiant, dying proclamation of ultimate, transcendent loyalty. Father Pro's martyrdom reinvigorated that beleaguered Church, whose countless faithful, never again afraid, would throng John Paul II when he visited Pro's beloved Mexico fifty-two years later.

## THE SHEPHERD KING

The letters of Paul to the Thessalonians are among his earliest. The job of Shepherd and the job of King couldn't be more different from each other. Shepherds are on the lowest rung of society, kings are at the top. But God says, through the prophet Ezekiel, that the Messiah will lead in a way very different from earthly authorities who lord it over their people and cause harm with their poor leadership.

Our King takes on the job himself. Christ, like a Shepherd, will give rest, seek out the lost, bring back the strayed and scattered ones. He will heal the wounded and bind up the injured. He does not delegate, but will "shepherd them rightly." We have a king who cares for us and who is not afraid to "judge between one sheep and another" (Ezekiel 34:17).






