## We are People of Hope!

“So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God.” (Zephaniah 3:17) Prophets throughout Judaic history prepared us for the coming of Christ. And he came. That is what we just finished celebrating with Christmas! Jesus was born. Jesus grew up in a loving family. He learned a trade. And then, one day, he began his public ministry, fulfilling his mission. He preached, he cured the sick and he taught; both with words and by example. He also left us a person to use, since he knew he would be leaving us, the Holy Spirit! He promised us that there were many rooms in his Father’s house and that he had made a place for us.

These are words of hope! There are times when we look at the world we live in and feel despair. We just went through the most contentious political campaign in any of our memories. We are still battling a worldwide pandemic. We still are told to stay home, and our children have not been with their peers in school for almost a year. However, I suggest we look at the virtue of hope. There is a new administration in Washington. We need to double down on our prayers that our legislators start to cooperate with each other so they can get policies that benefit the common good. In fact, I encourage you to contact your representatives and tell them just that. We want to see action. The time for squabbling needs to end. There is a vaccine for this virus that has been a plague on the world. It is taking us time to figure out how we will get it to everyone, but we know the task will get done. This country has faced many big challenges, and we always seem to step up and meet them. We have hope.

I think about today’s Gospel. It opens with, “After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the Gospel of God.” Let’s stop right there. John was arrested. This is Jesus’ cousin, the man who baptized him and launched his public ministry. Don’t you think that would give Jesus pause? But Jesus continued his mission. Since he was a man, I presume he had to tamp down his feelings to continue his work. He goes on to say, “This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand...” Jesus had hope. He believed that the kingdom of God was at hand.



We continue the mission of Jesus and that includes spreading hope. Pope Francis, in an address he pronounced in 2013, said, “This is how Christian hope is: having the certainty that I am walking toward something that is, not something that I hope may be. This is Christian hope. Christian hope is the expectation of something that has already been fulfilled and which will certainly be fulfilled for each one of us.” He continues, “Thus, to hope means to learn how to live in expectation. Learn how to live in expectation and find life.” An example of living in expectation is the pregnant woman. For nine months, she lives with the expectation of a baby being born. She learns how to live with what will be, not what might be.

We know we have been saved by the birth, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Even though Lent is still a month away, maybe we have felt living in these times has felt like an awfully long Lenten period. But I believe that we should be able to contemplate and to foretaste, in ourselves and in what surrounds us, the signs of the Resurrection, of Easter. Once again, there will be a new creation, as there is each year’s Easter morning. I pray that each of us can keep that Easter hope alive as each day goes by.

## FEAST OF ST. FRANCIS DE SALES

Feast Day: January 24th

Saint Francis de Sales was born on August 21, 1567. As a young man, Francis was sent to study in Paris. While there, he consecrated himself to the Blessed Virgin Mary and made a vow of chastity. After Paris, Francis went on to study law in Padua. Once he finished his studies, he told his parents he wished to become a priest. His father strongly objected, but after much gentle persuasion, he finally relented.

After his ordination, Francis was appointed Provost (archdeacon) of the Diocese of Geneva where he preached, heard confessions, gave advice, and ministered to the people. The archdeacon was the bishop's assistant and, in some cases, such as caring for the sick, visiting prisoners, and training priests, the archdeacon served as the bishop's representative.

In 1602, Francis became the Bishop of Geneva. Francis reformed religious communities and lived simply so that he could provide better for the poor and needy and whom he loved greatly. He was well known for his patience, goodness, and mild nature. Francis wrote many letters and several books including, "An Introduction to the Devout Life," "Treatise on the Love of God," and several more!

### Founder and Patron

Saint Francis de Sales and Saint Jane Frances de Chantal founded together, in 1607, The Institute of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin. This community was founded for young girls and widows who felt called to religious life but lacked the strength for the rigors of other communities. These Sisters, through works of mercy, practiced the virtues Mary exemplified when she visited her cousin, Elizabeth – humility, piety, and charity. Today, some Visitation Communities teach, while others are cloistered contemplatives. Saint Therese of Lisieux's sister, Leonie, was a Visitation Sister and is now a Servant of God.

In addition to the Visitation Order which was specifically founded by Saint Francis de Sales, many other orders have been founded under his patronage, such as Fransalians – Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales, MSFS (founded by Servant of God, Fr. Peter Marie Mermier), the Salesians (founded by Saint John Bosco) and the Oblates of Saint Francis de Sales (founded by Father Louis Brisson).

### A Path for Everyone

The teachings of Saint Francis de Sales focus on the realization that holiness and sainthood are for all people. He wanted everyone, no matter what their state in life, to know that they could become Saints!

### Sayings

Saint Francis de Sales has left us with a treasury of sayings that speak in simple ways about what matters most. Here are just a few of his quotes. There are many more!

"Be who you are and be that well to give glory to your Creator."

"Have patience with all things, but first of all with yourself."

"Nothing is so strong as gentleness; nothing so gentle as real strength."

"Doing little things with a strong desire to please God makes them really great."

"What we need is a cup of understanding, a barrel of love, and an ocean of patience."



### The Last Days of Saint Francis de Sales

Francis de Sales died on December 28, 1622 at the age of fifty-six. His final words were, "God's will be done! Jesus, my God and my all!" Francis was beatified by Pope Alexander VII in 1661. He was then canonized by Pope Alexander VII four years later in 1665. In 1877, Pope Pius IX declared Saint Francis de Sales a Doctor of the Church, the "Doctor of Love."

Because of his meek and cheerful personality, he is known as "The Gentleman Saint." He strove to attract people through goodness and gentleness. He used to say, "A spoonful of honey attracts more flies than a barrel of vinegar!"

Saint Francis de Sales' feast day is celebrated on January 24. He is the patron saint of authors, writers, the Catholic Press, journalists, and the deaf. **Saint Francis de Sales, pray for us!**




### “KAIROS” MOMENTS

Our readings today speak of “Kairos” times, of God proclaiming new moments of opportunity of encounter with the Divine. From Jonah, we hear of God’s summons to the people of Nineveh to turn from evil. We hear Paul tell the church in Corinth that those who live in Christ must avoid clinging to anything transient, as all is secondary to God. And we hear of the beginning of Jesus’ ministry in Mark, as Jesus proclaims a moment of both opportunity and crisis. In these passages, there are no delaying tactics, no getting caught up in life’s distractions. Just a simple moment of choice. Perhaps we have had “Kairos” moments like these, or we may be facing one now. Sometimes, amid the complexities and uncertainties of our lives, clear choices emerge, and God asks us to choose. And our always patient and merciful God will accompany us in our choices.

### THE INAUGURATION

Mark describes the beginning of Jesus’ ministry with his proclamation that the “kingdom of God is at hand.” The rest of Mark’s Gospel—all of Jesus’ preaching and healing, his death and resurrection—describes the inauguration of this kingdom of God. For Mark, the life of Jesus is the center point of history, where everything leads up to Jesus, and everything follows from Jesus. Mark then tells us that the first disciples follow Jesus immediately and wholeheartedly. They leave their work and family, all for Jesus. Because compared to Jesus and the life he offers, everything else is secondary.

Perhaps our invitations from God do not entail such dramatic life changes. But all who follow Jesus are called to align our life and values with his ways of love. As we continue to mature in love and in faith, we might ask: What needs to be renewed, re-oriented, or discarded in light of our life in Christ?

### JONAH AND NINEVEH

Jonah makes a rare appearance this week. The book of Jonah is a fascinating tale of God, stubborn Jonah, surprising Nineveh, and the famous fish (or whale). Please consider reading the whole book, just 48 verses, together with a good commentary. The book is read at Jewish services at Yom Kippur, as a profound reflection about God and about all of us.

Today’s passage takes place shortly after Jonah’s time in the fish’s belly. Jonah finally performs the task that God asks of him, to call the people of Nineveh to repentance. (Nineveh was notorious for its brutality.) Their sudden repentance is bitterly accepted by Jonah, as he resents God’s mercy for Nineveh. God reminds Jonah that the people of Nineveh are God’s beloved too. Like the parable of the Prodigal Son, the story hints at the vastness of God’s mercy, especially forgiveness of those who seem least deserving. We are reminded that all of us are sinners, and we are all in need of God’s mercy.

## A NEW DAY DAWNS

Today we hear how Jonah, sent by God to warn the people, storms through the streets of Nineveh, scaring the citizens out of their wits. And it works! God has a change of heart, seeing “by their actions” how the people turn from evil (Jonah 3:10). A new day dawns.

Next we hear Paul telling the Corinthians, “The world in its present form is passing away” (1 Corinthians 7:31). He calls for a change of heart. Stopping short of telling them to stop carrying out their everyday activities, he urges them—rather mysteriously—to live “as though” they aren’t doing the things they are doing. A new day has dawned.

Finally, Jesus stands on the shore and cries, “The kingdom of God is at hand!” (Mark 1:14). Simon and Andrew abandon their nets—and even their father—and follow him. A new day had dawned.

Everyone has to change when a new day dawns: the Ninevites, the Corinthians, the apostles, even Jesus! Didn’t a new day dawn today for us as well?

## FEAST OF FAITH

### The Penitential Rite

Standing together in the presence of the Lord, we acknowledge our weakness, our sins and faults and failings. But the penitential rite is really less about our sins than it is about God’s mercy. It is not a time for individual confession, like a mini-sacrament of reconciliation. It is, rather, a preparatory rite, preparing us to praise the mercy of Christ as we acknowledge our own weakness. When Simon Peter witnesses the miraculous catch of fish—when he realizes who is in the boat with him—he falls at Jesus’ feet with the words, “Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man” (Luke 5:8). We are like Peter. The more aware of the Lord’s presence we become, the more awareness we also have of our sinfulness, our weakness.

The penitential rite of the Mass takes several forms, from the traditional Confiteor or “I confess” to a litany, spoken or sung by the deacon or cantor with responses by the entire assembly. The penitential rite always includes the words Kyrie, eleison; Christe, eleison—Lord, have mercy; Christ, have mercy. This ancient Greek prayer came to the Roman liturgy from the East, and still echoes in many of the litanies of the Eastern Rite Churches. These words turn our gaze from our own weakness to the gentleness, the kindness, the forgiving love of Christ.

## SAINT PAULA (347-404)

### January 26th

The patron saint of widows, Paula was a wealthy Roman widowed with five children at age 32. Another widow introduced her to St. Jerome, a priest and papal secretary to St. Damasus. Jerome became her spiritual director, urging a life of asceticism and charity. When he learned she was fluent in Greek, he enlisted her help in translating Greek biblical texts for his new Latin

version of the Bible. Paula had joined the circle of nobility-born Roman women in Jerome’s orbit, and followed him to the Holy Land when he left Rome. She taught herself Hebrew, and exhausted her wealth building a monastery, three convents and a hospital in Bethlehem.


