

What is a Perfect Contrition?

All sin is serious, because sin puts distance between us and God. God is not the one to push us away, but he gives us the freedom to push him away.

And everyone on earth uses this freedom in a less-than-ideal way. The Scriptures make the matter clear: "All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us" (1 John 1:8). Self-deception is the worst sort of lie, because it adds an element of falsity to everything we say and do. It blurs our understanding of the world and people around us. It makes reality unreal.

When we sin, we distance ourselves from God and divine light.

Unless we see our world — and the people we love — in the light of God, we cannot see anything accurately. Sin hampers us. It disrupts our friendships, family life, and even our work.

All sin is serious, but some sins are more serious than others (1 John 5:16-17). Certain actions are immediately deadly to the soul, just as certain actions are immediately deadly to the body. We call these deadly transgressions "mortal sins." The denial of the Catholic faith is a mortal sin. Murder and adultery are other obvious examples. A mortal sin is an evil action that involves grave matter and the full consent of the will.

Other sins do not immediately kill the soul, but weaken it and wound it. Catholic tradition calls these "venial sins." We should recognize, however, that even these relatively small offenses have real consequences. If we make a habit of these, they can destroy us over time. We can come to think of offending God as something normal. Habitual, deliberate offenses — even if they're relatively small — will eventually destroy a relationship.

The good news is that God does not want us to live in sin and misery, and so he has provided us a "way of escape" (1 Corinthians 10:13). Sin may be a universal condition, but it is not inevitable.

St. John tells us: "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just, and will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9). St. Paul specifies that "confession" is something we do out loud, "with your mouth," not just with our hearts and minds (Romans 10:10).

By giving his clergy the power to forgive sins (John 20:23), Jesus established an ordinary way we can seek forgiveness. He made it very easy for us to find access to a "way of escape." He gave us the sacrament of confession — reconciliation — penance.

Unfortunately, in a time of pandemic, nothing is normal, or ordinary, or as easy as usual. But forgiveness remains a simple matter. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* counsels us, in such circumstances, to seek "perfect contrition" (see Catechism, no. 1452).

Pope Francis explained it well: "Do what the Catechism says. It is very clear: if you do not find a priest to hear your confession, speak to God, he is your Father, and tell him the truth. Enumerate your sins, ask the Lord for forgiveness with all your heart, and make an act of contrition. Promise him: 'Later I will confess, but forgive me now.' And immediately you will return to the grace of God."

The method is a gift. But the promise is important: we must have a firm intention to go to sacramental confession as soon as possible, once circumstances allow.

This season does us the great favor of confronting us with the hard truth: we are sinners; we are sick. But it also presents us with a sure cure. More than we want to sin, we need to be well. Now is the time to accept the healing the Lord offers us.

SLOW COOKER MUSHROOM AND WILD RICE SOUP

Ingredients:

- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- 6 cups vegetable stock
- 1 cup wild rice
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 onion, diced
- 3 carrots, peeled and diced
- 3 stalks celery, diced
- 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon dried rosemary
- 2 bay leaves
- 1 pound mushrooms, thinly sliced
- 1/4 cup unsalted butter
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup half and half

Directions:

1. In a slow pot cooker, stir in vegetable stock, wild rice, garlic, onion, carrots, celery, thyme, rosemary and bay leaves; season with salt and pepper, to taste. Cover and cook on low heat for 6-8 hours. Add mushrooms during the last 30 minutes of cooking time.
2. Melt butter in a saucepan over medium heat. Whisk in flour until lightly browned, about 1 minute. Whisk in milk and half and half, and cook, whisking constantly, until slightly thickened, about 4-5 minutes; season with salt and pepper, to taste.
3. Stir milk mixture into the slow cooker. If the soup is too thick, add more half and half as needed until desired consistency is reached.
4. Serve immediately



PRAYER TO ST. JOSEPH

The prayer is ordinarily enriched with a partial indulgence (Handbook of Indulgences, conc. 19). During the Year of Saint Joseph, however—which lasts from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021—the use of this prayer has been included among those enriched with a plenary indulgence (see Decree of the Apostolic Penitentiary issued Dec. 8, 2020, section E). It may be said on any day of the Year of Saint Joseph, but especially on his various feast days or other devotional days dedicated to St. Joseph:

- March 19, 2021, the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary
- May 1, 2021, the Optional Memorial of Saint Joseph the Worker
- The nineteenth day of each month
- Every Wednesday, the traditional day of the week for devotions to Saint Joseph
- "St. Joseph Sunday" and suitable days of other liturgical rites in the Eastern Catholic Churches

To you, O blessed Joseph,
do we come in our tribulation,
and having implored the help of your most
holy Spouse,
we confidently invoke your patronage also.
Through that charity which bound you
to the Immaculate Virgin Mother of God
and through the paternal love
with which you embraced the Child Jesus,
we humbly beg you graciously to regard the
inheritance

which Jesus Christ has purchased by his Blood, and with your
power and strength to aid us in
our necessities.

O most watchful guardian of the Holy Family, defend the chosen
children of Jesus Christ;

O most loving father, ward off from us
every contagion of error and corrupting
influence;

O our most mighty protector, be kind to us and from heaven
assist us in our struggle with the power of darkness.

As once you rescued the Child Jesus from
deadly peril,

so now protect God's Holy Church
from the snares of the enemy and from all
adversity;

shield, too, each one of us by your constant
protection,

so that, supported by your example and your aid, we may be
able to live piously, to die in holiness, and to obtain eternal
happiness in heaven.

SAINT JOSEPH, SPOUSE OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

March 19th

The spouse of Mary the mother of Jesus and the legal father of Jesus according to Jewish law, Joseph is a model of humility and obedience to God's will. He followed God's instructions, given by angels in dreams, and took the pregnant Mary into his home as his wife, protected her and Jesus at the child's birth in Bethlehem through the family's sojourn in Egypt, and provided for them as a carpenter in Nazareth. This feast, which was celebrated locally as early as the ninth century, became a universal feast in the fifteenth century, when it was placed on the liturgical calendar. Pope Pius IX named St. Joseph Patron of the Universal Church in 1870; he is also the patron saint of carpenters, the dying, and workers.

"Being a guardian is the distinctive trait of Joseph: Being the guardian is his great mission . . . We look to Joseph as the model educator, who watches over and accompanies Jesus as he grows 'in wisdom, age and grace,' as the Gospel says. He was not Jesus' father: the father of Jesus was God, but he was a father to Jesus, he was a father to Jesus in order to help him grow. And how did he help him grow? In wisdom, age and grace." —Pope Francis, March 19, 2014.

GOD'S MERCY

Today's reading from the second book of Chronicles contains a sort of "mini-history" of Israel. It highlights God's mercies in choosing Cyrus the Persian to be an instrument of deliverance when the people were in captivity in Babylon. Despite their sinfulness and the deserved punishment they were undergoing, God's mercy was lavished on the people in the form of a miraculous act of liberation.

The Letter to the Ephesians, in much more theological terms, gives a similar account of a God "who brought us to life with Christ—by grace you have been saved." The author stresses that it was when we were "dead in our transgressions" that God saved us, an act of pure grace. He emphasizes that it is not our own efforts that freed us from sin ("this is not from you"); rather, "it is the gift of God." This, of course, is the heart of the entire Pauline corpus, that salvation comes to us by faith in God's mercy, revealed in the death of Jesus.

YEAR OF AMORIS LAETITIA FAMILY

The Church Celebrates the Family.

On March 19, 2021, the Church celebrates the fifth anniversary of the publication of Pope Francis's apostolic exhortation *Amoris Laetitia*, on the beauty and joy of love in the family. On this same day, Pope Francis will launch the year "Amoris Laetitia Family," which will conclude on June 26, 2022, during the X Meeting of Families in Rome with the Holy Father.

Pope Francis announced the year of "Amoris Laetitia Family" during his Angelus Message on the Feast of the Holy Family on December 27, 2020. He ended his address invoking the Blessed Mother, "May the Virgin Mary grant that families throughout the world be increasingly fascinated by the evangelical ideal of the Holy Family, so as to become a leaven of [a] new humanity and of a genuine and universal solidarity."

FEAST OF FAITH

Lent, a Season of the Word

Each year on the First Sunday of Lent we hear one of the Gospel accounts of the temptation of Jesus. In Luke's account, the devil cites the scriptures repeatedly, urging Jesus to interpret them in a false, self-serving way—if God sends angels to protect those whom God loves (as it says in Psalm 91), then prove it! But Jesus resists this insidious temptation by turning to scripture passages that tell of right relationship with God—living by God's word, trusting in God, and worshiping God alone.

Jesus himself listened to the inspired word of God and let it shape and form him. Through the liturgy, we do the same. The readings we hear at Mass can teach us, but that is not their primary function. Rather, the scriptures are meant to reveal the Lord to us, to let us experience his presence, and to form us in our Christian identity. Christ's presence is realized by his spoken word, "since it is he himself who speaks when the Holy Scriptures are read in the Church" (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 7). In the readings proclaimed at Mass, we hear the voice of Christ himself.


