St. Louise de Marillac Mission Statement

Our Lady of Fatima

Mary appeared to three peasant children near Fatima, Portugal, six times between May 13 and October 13, 1917, and asked for prayers for world peace and an end to World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia.

She entrusted the children with three secrets, regarding devotion to her Immaculate Heart, a vision of hell, and a “bishop in white” shot by soldiers firing bullets and arrows. Many connect the third secret to the attempted assassination of Blessed Pope John Paul II on May 13, 1981, and the pope thanked Mary for guiding the bullet and saving him.

At the Vatican last October 13, Pope Francis stood before the statue of Our Lady from the Fatima shrine and formally entrusted the world to Mary. Her feast day is May 13th.

THIS WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

St. Louise de Marillac Feast Day

Today, May 9th is the Feast Day of St. Louise de Marillac.

We will have special prayer in her honor at the beginning of every Mass this weekend. Her feast day was originally on March 15th, but was moved to May 9th which is the anniversary date of her beatification.

Louise de Marillac was born in 1591 and educated by the Dominican nuns at Poissy. She married Antoine LeGras and they had one son. After her husband died in 1625, Louise joined with a French country priest named Vincent de Paul to co-found the Daughters of Charity. With his support, Louise set up a center in her home to train young women in the service of the poor. The Daughters of Charity was founded in 1633. Louise took her vows and began her lifelong work of traveling throughout France establishing orphanages, hospitals and other institutions to help the sick and the poor. She was canonized by Pope Pius XI in 1934.

IN MEMORIAM

JIM "FATHER BINGO" CORBITT

With great sadness we regret to announce that Jim Corbitt, a long time parishioner and volunteer extraordinaire passed away earlier this week. Jim was one of the most devoted and cherished volunteers ever known to the community of Saint Louise de Marillac. Since 1987, he operated and managed the weekly Friday night bingo games here. Prior to the pandemic's untimely closing of the bingo program, his tireless efforts raised nearly \$3 million dollars to benefit the parish school and other parish programs. For his herculean efforts he earned the well-deserved nickname "Father Bingo".



For more than three decades, Jim could be found here every Friday night guiding the parent volunteers, greeting guests, and taking care of all the details required to run a successful program. That wasn't the end of his service though. During the week he spent time reviewing the books, ordering supplies, working with vendors, repairing equipment and setting up for the next week.

Jim had just celebrated his 85th birthday and 45th wedding anniversary when he experienced a major health event that ultimately led to his passing. Jim's family legacy includes his loving wife, Sharon; two daughters, Candy and Janelle; two grandchildren, Steven and Jenna; and two great grandchildren. His youngest daughter, Janelle, is a graduate of St. Louise de Marillac School.

A celebration of Jim's life will take place later when we can gather safely as a community to remember in gratitude the devotion and dedication that "Father Bingo" gave as an example to all. In the meantime, condolence cards may be left at the parish office, care of Sharon Corbitt.

Jim gave far more than he ever received. May he now rest in peace and be welcomed into the loving embrace of his Heavenly Father. Thank you Jim for the example of love and devotion you were for all of us.

THIS WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

Construction Challenges

When the parish was notified that a Called to Renew grant from the Archdiocese was going to be provided to replace carpeting in the church, permission was requested to defer the project until the parish was able to set aside enough funds to refurbish the entire sanctuary, including new lighting, pews, sound system, and installation of a permanent baptism font.

Because of the closure of churches due to the pandemic, it was recommended that some, but not all, of these renovations should be completed while the church was not in use. Given the nearly \$100,000.00 grant that would expire if the project didn't begin within six months, it was decided to move forward and replace flooring and install the baptism font.

Planning for the projects began, with a timeline of late spring to early summer set to begin work. But the Supreme Court accelerated that timeline with recent rulings that allow for a return to indoor services. While most churches have opted to remain outdoors or online until it was safer to return indoors, it was clear that there was a desire to return to our spiritual home. Gratefully most parishioners have been gracious and understood that given our renovation predicament, our community would "offer it up" and continue to remain outdoors until the work could be completed.

The first task began by removing the pews and vinyl composition tiles underneath the pews. From previous renovations, it was known that the mastic used to glue the tile to the concrete contained asbestos. It was decided to remove this hazardous material at a cost of approximately \$33,000.00.

To accomplish the abatement and removal of tile required taking out all of the pews from the church. For now they are being stored in Msgr. Pierce Hall. Replacing or renovating the pews was deemed too costly, so for now repairs will be made and the existing pews will be reinstalled.

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

LOVE IS REAL

In today's Gospel, Jesus likens our relationship with him to a plant with many Love. Songs and books, plays and artistic masterpieces have been created to convey the truth that love is real. As Christians, we know that love is of God. In laying down his life, Jesus pours out God's selfless, sacrificial, undying love. Jesus opens the door to a new relationship between God and humanity, that of friendship, of intimate closeness. Jesus calls us to show this same love for others, knowing that in doing so, we fulfill God's will. As the account of Peter, Cornelius, and all in his household attests, this great love of God cannot be contained by our preconceived notions of the way things are in the world.

THE CALL AND CAUSE OF LOVE

Love calls and causes us to do great things, more than we might believe we are capable of. While some are called to give their lives as martyrs, most of us find ourselves called to lay down our lives in smaller ways in the midst of everyday life. Parents lose sleep in the early moments of their baby's life, and again as their teens mature and gain independence. Adult children change their plans to care for aging parents. We hear the call of love as we become attentive and respond to the needs of the poor, lonely, sick, and vulnerable. Love causes us to turn our lives around, to strive to become more Christ-like in our words and actions. Peter followed this call of love when he entered the house of Cornelius, a Gentile. He was likely as astounded at the outpouring of the Holy Spirit as were the believers who accompanied him, yet love caused Peter to see beyond the accepted boundaries of religion and race, seeing instead evidence of the Lord's great love at work.



THE JOY-FILLED WAY OF LOVE

Following the Lord calls us to sacrifice for the sake of others, giving our attention, time, and resources in order to share Christ's care and compassion. Jesus shows us that giving of self, pouring ourselves out in love for another, is a joy-filled way of life. Joy is more than a feeling and is deeper than happiness. Joy comes with the assurance that Christ is with us when our lives mirror the life and way of our Master. Joy is a sense of fulfillment in knowing and sharing Christ's love. When we reach out in love, Christ's joy fills our hearts. Strengthened by the power of the Holy Spirit, we find the grace to follow Jesus' command to love one another.

THE PRESENCE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

We have a unique episode in the Acts of the Apostles today. A whole roomful of people are baptized with the Holy Spirit before they are baptized with water! The verb used—“the Holy Spirit ‘fell’ on them” (Acts 10:44)—is characteristic of the way the Spirit works throughout the book of Acts: powerful and surprising. Though this “baptism” is not the normative way the New Testament describes baptism, it is still a good reminder today that the Holy Spirit is not controlled by whether or not we pour water, but rather that our sacramental signs reveal the presence of the Spirit at work among us. And we have a double reinforcement of how this work is accomplished from a Letter and a Gospel bearing John’s name. It is love, self-sacrificing and self-giving love, that manifests the Spirit of Jesus in our midst. It is love that is the greatest of commandments. The Spirit is manifested equally through those who live in that love.

FEAST OF FAITH

The Creed

Following the readings and the homily, we stand together and say or sing the Creed, our profession of faith. The Creed is a solemn statement of belief, a “rule of faith” (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 67). It states the core of what we believe about God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The language of the Creed is knotty and difficult at times, precisely because its purpose is to express with precision what we believe about God. The Creed that we pray most often, the Nicene Creed, came out of the earliest ecumenical councils: Nicea in 325 and Constantinople in 381. It originated in a time of great controversy about the divinity of Christ, and thus the longest section of the Creed relates to Christ, truly human and truly God.

The Creed is both communal and personal: it is “we,” but it is also “I.” In the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, it is only after listening to the teaching of the Church and professing faith in the Holy Trinity that the candidate is admitted to the sacraments. So it is every Sunday. We listen to the word, we profess our faith, and then we come to the altar .

SAINT MARY MAZZARELLO (1837-1881)

May 14th

An Italian peasant, Mary worked long hours in the fields and vineyards. She attended Mass frequently and joined a sodality whose members in 1860 were asked to nurse typhoid victims. Mary caught the fever and nearly died. Because of weakened health, she started a dressmaking business to employ local girls. This was the beginning of the Salesian Sisters of St. John Bosco, which now has 1,400 houses in 54 countries . Mary is enshrined in Turin next to St. John Bosco, founder of the Salesians men’s order.

CARDINAL MCINTYRE FUND

This weekend, May 8th and 9th is the collection for the Cardinal McIntyre Fund for Charity.

In 1948, shortly after he was appointed Archbishop of Los Angeles, Cardinal James Francis McIntyre recognized that certain institutions and agencies were facing hardships because of inadequate financing.

These organizations were ineligible for funding through public sources such as the Community Chests (predecessor to the United Way) and included: family welfare; institutions for the aged; health and youth services; adoption agencies, care for the blind, hard of hearing, mentally retarded and handicapped. Also needed were funds for maternity care, emergency relief and expanded social services in distressed neighborhoods.

The “Fund” provides emergency help to persons who have nowhere else to go. The Fund is not a replacement or supplement for welfare or other forms of public assistance. It does not support persons’ living needs on a continuing basis. Rather the Fund acts to solve immediate, pressing problems: food and milk for three days, lodging for the night, emergency medical care, rent to tide over a financial crisis or a utility bill to keep the water or heat turned on for the week.

Your contributions to the Cardinal McIntyre Fund for Charity make you a sharer in our parishes’ works of mercy, and in their rewards of grace.
