LETTER FROM ARCHBISHOP GOMEZ

June 12, 2021

Dear Brother and Sisters in Christ,

The coronavirus pandemic has affected our world and society in ways we could never have imagined.

Early on in the pandemic many people experienced great fears and anxieties in the face of tremendous uncertainty. We recognized the fragility of our human nature. However, it also brought us closer together as one family seeking the good and wellbeing of the other. Most importantly, through this pandemic, we came to recognize our deep reliance on God and the truth of God's abiding love for us, His sons and daughters.

We remain strong in our faith knowing that God will always be by our side.

Thankfully, we continue to make significant progress in our fight against the pandemic in the three counties of the Archdiocese. We can look forward to better days in which we can actively live our faith as the Body of Christ in our parish communities.

And so, on June 19th and 20th, I encourage the Catholic faithful of the Archdioceses of Los Angeles to return to in-person Sunday Mass and the celebration of the Sacraments, especially for those who are in good health.

By this letter, effective June 19, 2021, the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation in response to the coronavirus pandemic will be lifted for the Catholic faithful of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

Those who have serious and legitimate reasons (e.g., illness, underlying health conditions that renders them susceptible to illness, significant fears of becoming ill, etc.,) are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation.

In these cases, Pastors are to encourage the faithful to keep the Lord's Day holy by reading the Gospels, praying with their families, or joining themselves to the sacrifice of Mass by making an Act of Spiritual Communion.

Lastly, Pastors are asked to refer to the Archdiocese's "Guidelines on Liturgical Celebrations and Religious Services" to help their parishes transition into this new phase of our life, ministry, and worship as a Church.

Know that I am praying for you, and I ask you to please pray for me and my ministry.

May Jesus, through the intercession of our Blessed Mother Mary and St. Joseph, bless us with good health, peace, and joy,

UPDATED COVID GUIDELINES

The reopening plan for the State of California, the County of Los Angeles and the Archdiocese means that some changes will be made to the health orders that have guided our practices during the pandemic. For a full list of these guidelines, please visit our parish website.

Most notable among the changes is that the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass Sunday Mass and Holy Days in response to the coronavirus pandemic is lifted effective June 19, 2021.

Due to the ongoing renovations in church, we will not be able to return to the inside of the church for a few more weeks. This is a great sacrifice our community is making, especially as the weather begins to heat up! We are grateful for your patience as we endure these last few weeks of inconvenience.

There are some other changes that will be implemented now:

- We can now open for prayer group meetings, ministerial gatherings, and social gatherings provided that sensible public health precautions are observed. Groups and ministries are allowed to meet indoors. Due to the construction, our indoor meeting spaces will be limited. We will try to accommodate meeting requests to the best of our ability. Please contact the Parish Office for any questions or to reserve a room.
- Masks are not required for fully vaccinated individuals outdoors or indoors for religious services or gatherings.
- Masks are required for unvaccinated individuals outdoors when social distancing is not possible, and at all times indoors.
- We will no longer be taking reservation for Confessions. Instead it will be first come, first serve basis. Confessions will take place inside the 5th Grade and 8th Grade classrooms. Please line up on the sidewalk below the classrooms. Confessions will still be on Wednesdays from 4 PM to 5:15 PM and Saturdays from 2:30 PM to 4 PM.
- If you are feeling ill, please stay home.

We are grateful for everyone's cooperation and patience as we begin to implement a return to opening our facilities. Praise be God and may we all continue to be considerate of each other and pray for those who have suffered because of the pandemic.

Renovation Realities

Most of us recall the old Verizon commercial that asked "Can you hear me now?"

In the case of our current renovation, some may be wondering if some of the improvements that have been mentioned might indicate that the sound system is being replaced. Alas, that is not the case.

This current project did include some enhancements to the existing system and also will replace some of the wiring that will improve some of the functionality of the current sound system. However, items like speakers are not being replaced. There simply were not sufficient funds at this time to provide the complete renovation needed.

Also given that the church will now have different surfaces than it previously did (all of the carpet is being removed and replaced with porcelain tile) it seems appropriate to study the acoustical changes before investing large sums of money to replace the existing components.

It is our hope that one of the next phases will include a complete updating and replacement of aged speakers and components.

Renovation is continuing to move along nicely. We are hopeful that the August 15th date is a very realistic possibility. We should know in the next 2 to 3 weeks if that will be possible. We are grateful for everyone patiently awaiting the reopening and ask your continued support and prayers for a successful project completion.

TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

WHO IS THIS?

Though we re-enter Ordinary Time already knowing that Jesus is the Son of God (see the centurion's words at the end of the Palm Sunday Passion reading from Mark's Gospel), the long succession of Sundays confronts us again with the question that each Christian community, each individual Christian faces continually throughout life: "Who is this?" (Mark 4:41), and prompts an "examination of conscience" regarding the practical consequences of our response. This year's Gospel readings from Mark suggest that we find our answer in the cross and in the Eucharist. Today's stark challenge of Jesus' call to discipleship is, thankfully, balanced by the comfort we can take in relating—perhaps only too well—to the disciples' fears. Though we welcome Jesus in Word and Eucharist Sunday after Sunday, don't we all, from time to time during our lives' "ordinary time," experience Jesus' "real absence"?

SEA AND WIND

As always in Ordinary Time, today's Old Testament sets the stage for the Gospel. God, who in Jesus will "rebuke the wind" and "command the sea to be still" (Mark 4:39), "addresses Job out of the storm" (Job 38:1), speaking to the turmoil in Job's heart, calling to mind the primal chaos of creation's untamed sea, reminding Job that God's mighty word then was enough to command order and bring forth life. In today's Gospel, the disciples' fear, even near despair, takes center stage. Are any of us strangers to such emotions? Squall-force winds buffet their boat, waves break over it, and Jesus might as well not be there. Mark's account is especially grim. Alone among the evangelists, he tells us that Jesus is in the stern, the very back of the boat, not just asleep—sound asleep! Only Mark adds the detail, "on a cushion" (4:38).

AWAKEN CHRIST


Though we welcome Jesus in Word and Eucharist Sunday after Sunday, haven't we all, from time to time, experienced Jesus' "real absence"? This personal application should comfort us, as it has generations of disciples before us. Though the "boat" is, primarily, a symbol of the Church, never forsaken by Christ, carried safely across time's stormy waters, Saint Augustine preaching on this very Gospel sixteen hundred years ago noted that, since each of us is a temple of God, each one's heart is a sailing boat. Consider any temptation, says Augustine, as "the wind, the surging of the sea," and do what the disciples did: wake up Christ, "the sleeper in your heart," by recalling his words and commands. Then be like the wind and the sea: "The sea obeys him, the wind is still." Whenever emotions make our hearts turbulent, whenever Christ seems absent or at least asleep, "let us not despair but awaken Christ, so that we may sail in quiet waters, and reach at last our heavenly homeland."


NATIVITY OF JOHN THE BAPTIST

June 24th

In the Gospels, John, a kinsman of Jesus through their mothers, preached repentance and baptized to prepare for the Messiah's coming. This feast marks his exceptional birth to the aged priest Zechariah and the equally aged and barren Elizabeth. The angel Gabriel announces his birth in a vision to Zechariah, who hesitates in believing and is struck mute until eight days after John's birth. Then, Zechariah, in a beautiful canticle that ends the first chapter of Luke's Gospel, proclaims that John "will be called prophet of the Most High." John's eventual beheading is commemorated with an Aug. 29 feast. A patron saint of Canada and Jordan, John is also the patron of Florence and the Knights Hospitaller of St. John.



FEAST OF FAITH

The Collection: A Privilege

As the altar is prepared for the celebration of the Eucharist, the collection is taken up. In the early church, this part of the Mass must have been something to behold, as the people suddenly began to move, bringing forward to the deacons and priests freshly-baked bread and fine wine. Then, after the Eucharistic Prayer, that same community came forward again in the Communion procession, and they received back the very gifts they had given, now transformed into something infinitely more precious than bread and wine: the very Body and Blood of Christ.

Beginning around the eleventh century, it became the custom for people to present money instead of bread and wine, and the procession of the faithful gradually disappeared (it survives in the liturgy of Holy Thursday). But the meaning is the same. We continue to bring the fruit of our labors and to offer them freely to God. And God continues to transform them into Christ. It is through our generous sharing of time, talent, and treasure that our parishes can preach the gospel, reach out to the sick and the imprisoned, and celebrate the sacraments.




