

Grandparent's Day

On the first Sunday after Labor Day, we celebrate grandparents. This holiday began in 1979 when then President Jimmy Carter proclaimed that day as National Grandparents' Day. According to its founders, the purpose of the day is threefold: To honor grandparents, to give grandparents an opportunity to show love for their children's children and to help children become aware of the strength, information and guidance

older people can offer.

In the 1970's there was a TV show called *The Waltons*. It depicted a multi-generational family in rural Virginia during the Great Depression and World War II. It centered around 5 people: the son, John Walton, Jr. (John-boy), his parents John and Olivia Walton and his paternal grandparents Zebulon "Zeb" and Esther Walton. I mention this show because of the way it depicted the grandparents. They weren't clueless, they weren't smart-mouthed, they were wise and shared a lifetime of experience. When actress Ellen Corby had a stroke, her character Esther continued on the show struggling with the consequences of a stroke, slurred speech, and difficulty walking. The couple were depicted as dignified. It would be great if all of Hollywood could present older persons in this manner in today's TV shows and movies.

We learn a story of The Blessed Virgin Mary's parents, St. Saint Joachim, and St. Anne. The grandfather of Jesus, felt estranged from those around him because he had no children; his life, like that of his wife Anne's, was considered useless. So, the Lord sent an angel to console him, and he heard, "Joachim, Joachim! The Lord has heard your insistent prayer" and Mary was born shortly after.

An aspect I like about Grandparents' Day is that it is reciprocal. It both honors grandparents and also allows grandparents to show their love for their grandchildren. Another purpose of the day is to honor the wisdom of those who have a lifetime of experience to share.

In the Catholic faith, we see the affect grandparents have on their grandchildren. Today's parents are very busy. Most homes are two income homes, and it is grandparents who often are the primary caregivers. I frequently see grandparents, often grandmothers, in Church with their young grandchildren, helping them make the sign of the cross, teaching them the Our Father, and make the appropriate responses during the Mass. These early lessons will have an impact on the children's faith journey. Grandparents are often the family members who protect the traditions of our faith. As caregivers they are important players in teaching their grandchildren. This includes how they live their faith.

Pope Francis created a World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly in 2021 that will be celebrated every year on the fourth Sunday in July. At a celebration of the first World Day, Pope Francis said, "Dear Grandfathers and Grandmothers, Dear Elderly Friends, "I am with you always" (Mt 28:20): this is the promise the Lord made to his disciples before he ascended into heaven. They are the words that he repeats to you today... The whole Church is close to you... and cares about you, loves you and does not want to leave you alone!"

Enjoy the day with your parents and grandparents, children. This is a special day .



THE MESSIAH FORETOLD

From toddlerhood to old age, we grow in mastery of our own lives, our bodies, and our destiny. This mastery is hard won, and we don't let go of autonomy easily. Much of this self-mastery involves the avoidance of pain or discomfort, so when we hear things like "take up your cross" and "lose your life," we tend to resist the message.

James says that faith without works is dead. Ouch! That is really a direct message! One way to look at this, as well as the part about losing our life to find it, is that faith is a process of more and more openness to God's direction of our lives. It is very hard for us to give up control, but perhaps what we are being asked to do is not to become passive and babyish, but to allow God to direct where our self-mastery will lead and what it will accomplish. We are asked to relinquish the need to control the results of our efforts; to risk, as Jesus did, the loss of everything we are working to achieve. We are asked to let God take the lead and to control the results, even though we may never see those results.

JUBILEE

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles will soon launch the "Forward in Mission" Jubilee Year in honor of the 250th anniversary of the founding of Mission San Gabriel Arcángel, the birthplace of Christian faith in Los Angeles, as it was the first church in what is now the Archdiocese. The Jubilee Year will be from September 11, 2021 through September 10, 2022.

This is to revive the life of faith in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles through the proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the raising up of a new generation of missionary disciples.



When Jesus first sends his disciples to proclaim the kingdom of God in word and deed, he sends them two by two (Mark 6:7). To raise up a new generation of missionary disciples, the Archdiocese of Los Angeles will encourage three simple missionary practices 2x2: Gospel reflection, prayer, and acts of charity and justice.

Reflecting together on the life and words of Jesus in the Gospels awakens faith and helps us share Him with others. Praying together aloud opens hearts to Jesus. Doing acts of charity and justice together with intentionality shows the love and mercy of Jesus. Engaging in these missionary practices will form hearts for mission and increase confidence in proclaiming the Gospel.

Step into Christ, step out to Mission—Holy Doors of Mission

During the Jubilee year, a plenary indulgence will be granted to all the faithful who meet the usual conditions and visit any of the pilgrimage sites within the Archdiocese to spend some time there at least to pray the Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be with the intention of uniting themselves with the missionary spirit of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Star of the New Evangelization, and St. Junipero Sera, founder of Mission San Gabriel Arcángel.

A Holy Door represents Jesus Christ, who states: "I am the door" (*John 10:1*). Christ is the entry to new life. To cross the threshold of the Holy Door is to step into Christ, and to pass through the doors of the Church into the world is to step into mission. The Lord we encounter in the Church, above all in the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, sends us forth from there to be missionaries of the Gospel.

Beginning September 12th, the nearest of the Holy Door pilgrimage sites would be Mission San Gabriel Arcángel and Our Lady of Guadalupe Church in Irwindale.

FEAST OF FAITH

Offering and Intercessions

In this holy moment—with the consecrated bread and wine, the Body and Blood of Christ, upon the altar—we pray for a share in the fruits of Christ’s sacrifice. We offer to God what God has given to us, and we intercede for the Church and the world. We pray for the pope and for all the bishops, and we mention the bishop of our local church by name. We pray for the clergy and for all the people of God. We pray in a special way for those who have died. And we pray for ourselves, that one day, with Mary and all the saints, we may come to that place where Jesus already reigns. These prayers of intercession, like the General Intercessions earlier in the Mass, broaden our focus and remind us that the Eucharist is offered not just for those gathered, but for the salvation of the entire world. The Eucharistic Prayer leads us from an intense focus on Christ, present in the consecrated host in the hands of the priest, to a loving sweep of prayer that embraces the world.

TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

SUFFERING, HOPE, AND LOVE

Our readings from Isaiah and from the Gospel of Mark confront us with the fact that the invitation to faith leads us into suffering. In Isaiah, the prophet accepts pain and shaming from others, as he trusts in God. In Mark, Jesus is blunt about this: “Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me.” When we embrace faith, we are confronted with our own fears about suffering and about losing comfort, status, and control over our lives. Life has plenty of suffering already, so why choose to add to it? Jesus points to a response: avoiding our fears and clinging to illusion and superficial comforts will not give us what we really want from life. Jesus offers a better, deeper life, a life grounded in God’s love. It is lived in hope of resurrection and the final triumph of this love.

A DIFFERENT LIFE

The Gospel of Mark reaches a turning point in today’s passage. About halfway through Mark, Jesus’ disciples begin to understand Jesus as the Messiah (or Christ). And Jesus begins to spell out just what is expected of those who follow him. The story then shifts to learning just what being Christ, and following Christ, actually means. Jesus shatters the expectation of a political or military power defeating Israel’s oppressors, and reveals a different kind of Messiah. The disciples later come to see that this different Messiah offers a different understanding of power, and of life itself.

We inhabit a world that honors power over others, through wealth or achievement or violence. Jesus invites us into a community and a way of life that honors the power of love and service to others. Lived fully, it is truly a different way of life. It is marked by great suffering and great joy, because it embraces the fundamental pattern of the death and resurrection of Jesus.

A “LARGE” FAITH

The letter of James is designed to enlarge your faith. James knew that his community faced trials that could lead them to abandon the faith, or perhaps to reduce faith to a comfortable, manageable size. In today’s passage, James calls the reader to resist reducing faith to safe, intellectual assent to teachings, and instead to expand one’s faith to actively engage in good works, especially in service to the poor.

To have a “large” faith is to move from apathy toward others’ sufferings to empathy and to action. A large faith leads to a large heart, where we can take in the enormity of suffering in the world around us, not become overwhelmed by it, and do what we can to relieve it. With a large heart, we can even squarely face our own sufferings, accepting our own tragedies with forgiveness and hope, and walking in empathy with all who share in suffering.

SAINT CATHERINE OF GENOA (1447-1510)

September 15th

Caterina Fieschi wanted to be a nun like her older sister, but instead was married at 16 to Giuliano Adorno. Their arranged union was not happy for Caterina; her husband had a child with his mistress and wasted much of their fortune. But in 1473 Caterina had a vision of Christ carrying his cross which changed her life. Thereafter, she devoted her life to prayer and caring for the poor in the slums of Genoa, Italy. Giuliano also changed, becoming a Franciscan tertiary. They both worked at the largest charity hospital in Europe, with Caterina advancing from volunteer to director. She also wrote about mysticism and was canonized in 1737.



DID YOU KNOW?

What to do if you are worried about family abduction

Family abduction happens when a child is taken or hidden by one family member from another, against custody or visitation rights. In some circumstances, family abduction is considered a crime, and can be prosecuted. If you are worried about a possible family abduction, you can take action. Have a valid custody agreement that outlines who can see or take your child, and when. Advise your child's school or daycare about custody arrangements, including who can and cannot pick up your child. For more information, visit missingkids.org/theissues/familyabduction.
