Politics and the Church

I hope you all are enjoying Grandparents' Day. Family is important, and children need to have a sense of the multigenerational aspect of their families. I have written in the past about the role of grandparents. This day has a message for the younger generation. It reminds the young that older people's greater perspective, depth of experience, and appreciation of life's profound rhythms are all part of a wisdom not to be taken lightly or ignored. At the same time, grandparents are reminded of their responsibility to establish a tone for generations to come: They must make the family traditions live and offer them as a promise to little children. This is not just traditions for the holidays or the traditions of the places the family came from, but also the traditions around their shared faith. If the Feast of the Virgen de Guadalupe is important to the family, the children need to learn all the ways the family celebrated this day in the past. This goes for Christmas and Easter as well. Not just the secular part, but the religious part as well. What traditions are steeped in your faith? Does your family set up a Nativity Creche? Does your family set up a Belen? Do you put up a Christmas Parol? Does your family attend Simbang Gabi? Grandparents can share these sacred traditions with their grandchildren who can eventually share them with theirs.

I like to imagine the life of Jesus. What was his relationship with his grandparents? Mary's parents, Joachim and Anne first appear in the apocryphal Gospel of James. The apocrypha are writings that are not included in the Bible but are considered to be inspired by God. Joseph's father, Jacob is mentioned in Matthew 1:16 "Jacob begat Joseph the husband of Mary." There is no mention of his mother and that is not unusual. Women were not held in high regard, so historians did not include them in their accounts.

The 1st century Jewish man rose before the sun, dressed in a simple woolen or linen tunic and leather sandals, went to work in the fields or at his trade for several hours before returning home for his morning meal of vegetables and bread. His home was no more than a few rooms, with walls of stone and mud and a roof of beams/branches and mud. After eating he returned to work. After his day's toil, the Jewish man would return home to his wife and children for an evening meal, a little teaching of the Scriptures and perhaps singing and dancing, and an early bedtime.



A Jewish man's wife, meanwhile, prepared meals, made and washed clothing, kept house, and cared for children. Remember, preparing a meal included carrying water, gathering firewood for the oven, killing, and preparing any animals they might own, work in the garden that provided the vegetables and fruits, and shopped in the market for any items they might need that they did not make at home. Making clothing was not just sewing garments, but also weaving the cloth to make the clothes from. A first century woman was very busy. So, I would assume Jesus' grandparents were around to watch out for him. I wouldn't be surprised to hear that they were story tellers, and Jesus learned much about his family history and how a young Jewish child should behave. He probably heard all of the Bible stories with characters like Jonah, Moses, and Noah. When Joseph and Mary married, she would have moved in with Joseph's family if they kept to the traditions of the time. I would like to believe Joseph's family might have lived near Mary's so her parents could be involved in raising Jesus, too. We don't know the facts, but we can surmise based on what we know of the people who lived in the time of Jesus.

So, our 21st century grandparents play roles not all that different from Jesus' grandparents!


ST. LOUISE WOMEN'S BOWLING LEAGUE

RELYING ON GOD'S LOVE

Imagine being among those who heard Jesus address the Pharisees and scribes in the encounter we hear in today's Gospel: "What man among you having a hundred sheep and losing one of them would not leave the ninety-nine in the desert and go after the lost one until he finds it?" Would you leave ninety-nine in the desert in order to find one lost sheep? In the parable, Jesus is showing us the depths of God's love, the illogical, incredible love God has for each of us. Moses counted on this loving mercy as he spoke for the wandering people; Saint Paul acknowledges his reliance on it in his letter to Timothy. God desires to draw you close, seeking you when you are lost. Are you ready to be drawn into God's loving embrace?

SILENCE IN MASS

At what points during Mass should there be silence? Is this required?

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal envisions that periods of silence be observed at specific points during each Mass. GIRM 45 states that the nature of silence "depends on the moment when it occurs in the different parts of the celebration. For in the Penitential Act and again after the invitation 'Let us pray', individuals recollect themselves; whereas after a reading or after the Homily, all meditate briefly on what they have heard; then after Communion, they praise God in their hearts and pray to him." And, of course, before Mass begins, silence in the church is helpful as people prepare for the liturgy. We should not simply move from one ritual to the next with no opportunity for silence in between; use the GIRM as the guide for incorporating silence into the Mass. As you consider how the liturgy is celebrated in your parish or school, make sure that silence is observed at the appropriate times to allow God to speak to our hearts!

ORDINARY TIME

Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ. Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

24TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

GOD OF SECOND CHANCES

If we were reflecting on all of today's scriptures and wanted to come up with one intimate name for God, perhaps it would be "God of Second Chances." Over and over we see examples of God offering just that. In Exodus, the Lord is frustrated by the behavior of the people, and Moses, speaking very boldly, has to talk God into calming down and recalling the covenant with Abraham and Sarah, Isaac and Israel. Psalm 51, "The Miserere," is the great psalm of repentance and cleansing. Take the time to read and pray with the whole psalm at your leisure. Paul confesses his own blasphemy and arrogance, and how Christ is using it now. In the extensive Gospel from Luke we experience Jesus using parables to tell about the widow and the lost coin, the shepherd and the lost sheep, and the lost son and a loving father's welcome.

TAKE ALL THE LOST HOME

In the 70s there was a popular Folk Mass song by Joe Wise, "Take All the Lost Home." It is like our Gospel reading today. For truly, we've all had moments when we have lost our way and needed others to get us back on track. Perhaps this means reconnecting with someone we once knew and making amends, or seeing a therapist to make things right. Maybe it means finally seeking help to stick with the diet and exercise plan, or joining a 12-step program to deal with an addiction. Could it be time to meet with a financial expert to manage credit card debt, or go to confession or meet with a spiritual director to find your way home spiritually? It is hard to ask for help or admit we are lost. We dread the reactions of others, thinking they will be angry, hurt, or defensive. We feel shame. Sometimes people hold grudges for years because neither they nor another will break down and make the first move. We feel fear. This sets us up for the classic story of the prodigal father, where we see two possible outcomes.

WELCOME HOME

The son returns home and, expecting the worst, confesses his sinfulness. His brother has an angry, self-righteous response, but the Father is full of joy and mercy. Such is the case in all the Gospel parables today. We hear God say, "You are the one who is important." There is another poignant song by Brian Flynn entitled "The Prodigal Father" that presents the perspective of the parent waiting and worrying about their lost child, watching the road and praying for the child's return. And if for some reason your own family will not accept you, you will find that there are many intentional families, friends, and parishes waiting with open arms to welcome you. Or perhaps you can offer the same welcome to another returning soul.

DID YOU KNOW?

How to respond to choking, part one

In a choking emergency, it is important to respond quickly and effectively. Experts suggest reviewing maneuvers regularly so that you are equipped to respond to such an emergency. For children over the age of one, if a child is coughing, encourage him to keep coughing — this could be the quickest way to clear the airway. If a child is having trouble coughing, talking, or breathing, provide immediate help. You can attempt the Heimlich maneuver to dislodge the object and clear the airway.
